

the said benefice of Frodingham and of the said benefice of Scunthorpe as aforesaid in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme and with the consent of the said Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln acting as such Bishop (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and also with the consent of the said Edward Mitford Weigall as the Incumbent of the said benefice of Frodingham in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date of the constitution of the said district of Scunthorpe that is to say as from the twenty-third day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine there shall be set apart out of the said sums of stock so held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for and for the benefit of the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said benefice of Frodingham and as part of the endowment of the same vicarage a sum of six thousand six hundred and sixty-six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence Local Loans Three pounds per Cent. Stock so as to produce a yearly sum of two hundred pounds as and for an endowment for the district of Scunthorpe aforesaid the amount of the annual dividends as they accrue due from the said sum of stock to be paid over from time to time to the duly licensed minister of the said district and when the same district shall under the provisions of the New Parishes Acts have become a new parish then to the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of such new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose that as from the day of the date upon which the said benefice of Frodingham shall next from whatever cause be avoided there shall be set apart out of the said sums of stock so held by us as and for part of the endowments of the same benefice as aforesaid such a further amount of stock as shall be sufficient to produce a further yearly sum of two hundred pounds as and for an additional endowment for the district or new parish (as the case may be) of Scunthorpe the amount of the annual dividends as they accrue due from the said additional sum of stock so to be set apart as last-mentioned to be paid over from time to time to the Minister of the said district of Scunthorpe or to the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said new parish of Scunthorpe as the case may be.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fifth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for compensating a spiritual person, to wit the Reverend Henry Morton, Clerk in Holy Orders, incumbent of the new parish of Saint Stephen, South Shields in the diocese of Durham whose emoluments as such incumbent have been diminished by reason of proceedings under one or both of the said Acts.

"Whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five the district of Saint Aidan South Shields was constituted under the New Parishes Acts or some or one of them, partly out of the said new parish, of Saint Stephen, South Shields, partly out of the parish of Westoe, and partly out of the parish of Saint Hilda, South Shields all in the said diocese of Durham, and the same district of Saint Aidan, South Shields, became a new parish on the fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the fees, dues, or other emoluments of the said Henry Morton as such incumbent as aforesaid, have been diminished by reason of the constitution of the said district and new parish of Saint Aidan South Shields, and that the payment to the said Henry Morton of the annual sum of three pounds would provide a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution.

"Now therefore we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that in respect of and in compensation for the diminution aforesaid there shall be paid by us to the said Henry Morton so long as he shall continue to be the incumbent of the said new parish of Saint Stephen South Shields and no longer, the annual sum of three pounds, payment of such annual sum being made (except as to the back payments hereinafter mentioned) in equal half-yearly portions upon the first day of May and the first day of November in each year but with the right also to a proportionate payment in respect of any period being less than half a year which may elapse between the first day of May or the first day of November (as the case may be) in any year and the avoidance from whatever cause by the said Henry Morton of the incumbency of the said new parish of Saint Stephen South Shields.

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of the said Henry Morton to receive the said annual sum of three pounds shall be held to have accrued and that payment thereof shall accordingly be made as from the fifth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, that being as aforesaid the
