

To the London County Council.

**T**AKE notice, that the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Company do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Metropolis Water Act, 1871, propose that the said Company shall, upon and from the several dates respectively undermentioned, give a Constant Supply of Water to such part or parts of the Company's water limits as are comprised within the following district or districts (that is to say) :—

Upon and after the 1st day of May, 1890, to so much and such part or parts of the parish of St. Mary, Battersea, in the county of Surrey, as is or are situated or contained within an imaginary line drawn from the River Thames at the Victoria Bridge of the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway, southwards along the said Railway to the crossing of the London and South-Western Railway, thence south-west along the London and South-Western Railway, to its junction with the West London Junction Railway, then north along the rear of the houses abutting on Brougham-street and Culvert-road to Battersea Park-road, then west along Battersea Park-road to the West London Junction Railway, then west along the said railway to the River Thames, then north and east along the River Thames to the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway, and which district or districts is or are described as No. 22, and coloured blue upon the plan annexed to the notice.

Upon and after the 1st day of September, 1890, to so much and such part or parts of the parishes of St. Mary, Battersea, and All Saints, Wandsworth, in the county of Surrey, as is or are situated or contained within an imaginary line drawn from the River Thames at the West London Junction Railway, westwards along the said railway to its junction with the London and South-Western Railway near Latchmere-road, thence south-westerly along the London and South-Western

Railway to Birdhurst-road, then north-west along the rear of the houses abutting on Birdhurst-road and Jews-row to the River Thames, then north-east along the River Thames to the West London Junction Railway, and which district or districts is or are described as No. 23, and coloured pink upon the plan annexed to the notice.

Upon and after the 1st day of January, 1891, to as much and such part or parts of the parishes of St. Mary, Battersea, and Holy Trinity, Clapham, in the county of Surrey, as is or are situated or contained within an imaginary line drawn from the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway, south-west along the London and South-Western Railway to its junction with the West London Junction Railway, then north along the rear of the houses abutting on Brougham-street and Culvert-road to Battersea Park-road, then west along Battersea Park-road to the West London Junction Railway, then east and south along the West London Junction Railway to the London and South-Western Railway near Latchmere-road, then south along the rear of the houses abutting on the west side of Latchmere-road, and south along the rear of the houses abutting on the south side of Elsley-road to Tyneham-grove, then south along the rear of the houses abutting on the west side of Tyneham-grove and Lavender-hill, then east and north-east along the rear of the houses abutting on the south side of Lavender-hill and Wandsworth-road to the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway, then north-west along the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway to the London and South-Western Railway, and which district or districts is or are described as No. 24, and coloured yellow upon the plan annexed to the notice.
