NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of prize money awarded for the captures by Her Majesty's ship "Griffon," specified below, will commence on Tuesday, the 21st instant, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Spring-gardens, S.W."

(enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.
