

thence generally westward along the middle of the said Swain Royd-lane for a distance of fifty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Back-lane and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of sixty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction, at Dean-lane Head with Dean-lane and continuing thence still south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary at or near to the house called or known as Egypt which boundary divides the said district parish of Wilsden-cum-Allerton from the new parish of Saint James Thornton aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

THE following Statute, passed on the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, and sealed on the thirteenth day of December, 1889, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statute iii § 22 framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria chapter 48) in relation to the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford duly made at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows being the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the thirtieth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and passed at such Meeting by the unanimous votes of those present and voting and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Statute iii § 12 (a.) such number of Fellows (not exceeding seven) as the Master and Fellows shall from time to time determine who shall reside and serve the College in one or both of the offices of Prælector and Tutor are entitled to hold their Fellowships during such residence and service in College and by Statute iii § 22 the sum of one hundred pounds per annum payable from the Corporate Revenues of the College is attached to the office of Tutors or Prælectors holding their Fellowships under the provisions of the above-named Statute iii § 12 a.

And whereas the Corporate Revenues of the College are now and are likely to continue to be insufficient to do more than meet the ordinary expenses of the College and the charges laid upon them by the Statutes, and the College is therefore debarred from appointing to such Tutorial

Fellowships as are contemplated by Statute iii, 12 a, and 11 a.

And whereas it is highly desirable that the College should be able to elect or retain as members of the Society able and experienced Teachers as long as they are willing to serve the College.

We the said Master and Fellows do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the said Act and by Statute XI framed by the Commissioners appointed by the said Act in relation to the said College alter and amend Statute iii § 22 by substituting for the words

"In addition to this emolument every Prælector or Tutor holding his Fellowship under the provisions of clause 12 (a) of this Statute shall be entitled to receive out of the Corporate Revenue the annual sum of one hundred pounds free of income tax together with such payment as may be assigned to him out of the Tuition Fund hereinafter-mentioned provided"

the words

"In addition to this emolument every Prælector or Tutor elected under clause 11 (a) or holding his Fellowship under the provisions of clause 12 (a) of this Statute shall be entitled to receive out of the Corporate Revenues such annual sum not exceeding one hundred pounds free of income tax as the Master and Fellows shall from time to time determine in the case of each such Prælector or Tutor together with such payment as may be assigned to him out of the Tuition Fund hereinafter mentioned; Provided that in fixing and from time to time varying such annual sum the Master and Fellows shall have regard both to the merits of each particular case and to the state of the corporate revenues for the time being: Provided also."
