REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

(DUNDEE.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Special Provisions for Movement of Cattle affected with Pleuro-Pneumonia for Slaughter.

1. Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia may be moved out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place within the burgh of Dundee for slaughter, in manner and under the conditions following, and not otherwise :

- (i.) The Cattle shall be moved, with a licence of the Local Authority of the burgh of Dundee, to the slaughter-house erected for the purpose at the east end of the northmost range of slaughter-houses within the public slaughter-houses belonging to the said Local Authority situate at Carolina Port, in the parish of Dundee, in the said burgh, in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of the diseased cattle with any other cattle during the movement.
- (ii.) The cattle shall be moved to the said slaughter-house accompanied by and in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority.
- (iii.) The cattle on-arrival at the said slaughter-house shall be forthwith slaughtered there in the presence and under the superintendence of the same Inspector or other officer, who shall forthwith report the fact of the slaughter to the Local Authority.
- (iv.) The said slaughter-house shall be specially appropriated for the slaughter of cattle under the provisions of this Order and shall not be used for the slaughter of any other cattle.
- (v.) The cattle after they are moved out of the Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place shall not at any time be permitted to come in contact with any other cattle.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Float or Cattle-Van.

2.—(1.) The float or cattle-van shall immediately after each occasion of use under this Order be cleansed and disinfected, by or under the superintendence of the Inspector or other officer aforesaid, as follows :

- (i.) The floor of the float or cattle-van and all other parts thereof with which the cattle, or

their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom : then

- (ii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water : then
- (iii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the float or cattle-van, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with animals.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878 :

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place means a Place for the time being a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia under the Act of 1878 :

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

REGULATIONS AS TO TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS.

WHEREAS by the Post Office Money Orders Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorized with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury to make Regulations relating to Money Orders, and to the payment thereof, and to the persons by or to whom Money Orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid.

And whereas the Postmaster-General has from time to time made Regulations accordingly.

And whereas it is intended on and after the 1st day of March next to authorize the payment of Money Orders by Telegraph between certain offices on the conditions hereinafter appearing.

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Cecil Raikes, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance and by virtue of the said Acts, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do, with the consent of Her Majesty's Treasury, make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Money Order (Telegraph) Regulations, 1890.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "the Postmaster-General" means the Postmaster-General for the time being.

The expression "Postmaster" means any officer in charge of a Money Order Office, and includes any officer of the Post Office acting under the instructions of the Postmaster.

The expression "Telegraph Money Order" means a Post Office Money Order, the payment of which at the office of payment is authorized by Telegraph.

The masculine includes the feminine, and the plural includes the singular, and the singular includes the plural.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1890, on and from which date the Regulations dated the 15th day of August, 1889, are hereby repealed, without prejudice nevertheless to anything already done in pursuance thereof.

4. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, Telegraph Money Orders may be issued and paid at any Head or Branch Post Office in the United Kingdom at which Telegraph and Money Order business is transacted.

5. Any person requiring the issue of a Telegraph Money Order must fill up the Money Order Requisition Form prescribed, from time to time, by the Postmaster-General, and must write in some conspicuous place on the said form the words "By Telegraph."

6. Upon receipt of a requisition for a Telegraph Money Order, and of the amount of the said Order, and all charges payable in respect of the said Order under these Regulations, the Postmaster shall—

(a.) Prepare a Money Order and Advice for the sum required, and write or stamp across the face of the Order the words "Telegraph Money Order," and across the face of the Advice the words "Remitted by Telegraph."

(b.) Hand to the person at whose request the Order is issued a receipt, in the form specified in the First Schedule hereto, for the amount of the Money Order and all charges for the remission thereof.

(c.) Send to the Postmaster of the office of payment a Telegram stating the number of the Order, the name of the person at whose request the Order is issued, the name of the person to whom payment is to be made and the amount remitted, such amount to be telegraphed in words (which Telegram is hereinafter referred to as a Telegram of Advice)

7. The following Rules shall apply to a Telegram of Advice:—

(a.) It shall be written by the Postmaster at the office of origin on the form used for the ordinary telegrams of the public, known and hereinafter referred to as the A Form.

(b.) It shall be repeated from office to office to insure accuracy.

(c.) The A Form shall bear postage stamps representing the amount payable (in accordance with the provisions of the Telegraph Acts, 1863 to 1885), and the Regulations for the time being made thereunder, for the transmission and repetition of the Telegram as an ordinary Telegram.

(d.) Such stamps shall be cancelled by the dated stamp of the office of origin, as in the case of an ordinary Telegram.

8. Any person requiring payment of a Telegraph Money Order must attend at the Money Order Office of payment, and

(a.) Produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Postmaster that he is the person entitled to receive the amount of such Order, and

(b.) Sign a receipt in the form specified in the second schedule hereto.

9. The following poundage shall be paid in respect of Telegraph Money Orders:—

Such poundage shall in every case be prepaid.

10. In addition to the poundage payable for a Telegraph Money Order, the person at whose request a Telegraph Money Order is issued shall pay for the Telegram authorizing payment at the office of payment, and for the repetition thereof, after the rates authorized by the Telegraph Acts, 1863 to 1885, and the regulations made from time to time thereunder.

11.—(1.) In case payment of a Telegraph Money Order is required, and no authority to make such payment has been received by the Postmaster, the Postmaster may, at the request of the person requiring payment, send to the Postmaster of the alleged office of issue a Telegram inquiring whether payment has been authorized as alleged (which Telegram is hereinafter referred to as a Telegram of Inquiry).

(2.) The following rules shall apply to a Telegram of Inquiry:—

(a.) It shall be written by the Postmaster at the office of origin on the A Form.

(b.) The A Form shall bear postage stamps representing the amount payable (in accordance with the provisions of the Telegraph Acts, 1863 to 1885, and the regulations for the time being made thereunder) for the transmission of the Telegram as an ordinary Telegram, and for a reply thereto.

(c.) Such Stamps shall be cancelled by the Dated Stamp of the office, as in the case of an ordinary Telegram.

(3.) The Postmaster of the alleged office of issue shall reply by Telegram to a Telegram of Inquiry.

(4.) The person requiring payment of a Telegraph Money Order, at whose request a Telegram of Inquiry is sent, shall prepay the charges for such Telegram and for a reply thereto after the rates authorized by the Telegraph Acts, 1863 to 1885, and the regulations made from time to time thereunder.

(5.) If it shall appear that there has been default on the part of any officer of the Post Office in transmitting authority for payment of the Money Order in question with reasonable despatch, the amount paid for the Telegram of Inquiry and the reply thereto shall be refunded to the person at whose request such Telegram was sent.

(6.) In any such case as last specified, where any question arises as to whether reasonable despatch has been used, the decision of the Postmaster-General upon such questions shall be final.

12. No Telegraph Money Order shall be issued for a greater amount than £10.

13.—(1.) Payment of a Telegraph Money

Order will only be made at the office specified in the original requisition.

(2.) If from any cause payment cannot be made at such office, the amount of the Telegraph Money Order will be repaid to the person at whose request the Order was issued; in the case of an Order remitted from any office in England or Wales, on application to "the Controller of the Money Order Office," General Post Office, London; in the case of an Order remitted from any office in Scotland, on application to "the Accountant," General Post Office, Edinburgh; and in the case of an Order remitted from any office in Ireland, on application to "the Accountant," General Post Office, Dublin.

(3.) Repayment will in all cases be made in

accordance with the rules for the time being in force as to the payment of Money Orders.

14. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, the Regulations made under the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880 (other than such as relate to Postal Orders as defined by such Regulations), shall apply to Telegraph Money Orders.
