**REGULATIONS
TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.**

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice, dated February 27, 1890, from the Governor of Malta, intimating that the restrictions enacted by Government Notice No. 6 of the 13th January last, on arrivals from Trieste, have been discontinued.

It is also notified that Government Notices No. 214 of 6th December, and 217 of 19th December, 1889, are revoked, and that the importation of the following articles from any of the countries bordering on the Mediterranean are forbidden:—Vine shoots, grapes, leaves, roots, or any other part of the vine plant, poles or supports of any kind used in the cultivation of vines, plants, shrubs, and trees of all sorts, and any part, flower, or fruit thereof, vegetable earth or vegetable or dried manure. It is also prohibited to land, except by special permission from the Collector of Customs, similar products reported as coming from other countries. The dried fruit of the vine and other dry fruits may be imported, provided the fruit has been carefully picked from the stalks and that no other part of the plant is introduced.

THE SEYCHELLES AND THE UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE, &c.
TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, the expression "Mauritius" in the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 11th day of March, 1859, relating to the transmission of Parcels between the Mauritius and the United Kingdom, and certain other places, shall be construed to mean and include the Seychelles Islands.

2. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act;

The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III. The District in which the said Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith shall, from and after the said tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, act as Auditor, and

which We hereby assign to him for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, and which shall be termed "The Essex Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, and the District of the Port Sanitary Authority named in Paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (6) of the said Article I.

ARTICLE IV. In this Order—

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.
