The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit :

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, it was directed that burials should be discontinued in the Wesleyan Chapel, in the parish of Swinton, Saint Peter, in the county of Lancaster, and also in the chapelyard, except as follows :—

"In such earthen graves now existing in the chapelyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations, widows, widowers, parents, and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth."

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Order of the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, be varied :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order of the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in so far as it affects burials in the said chapel and chapelyard, be read and construed as if the following words had been inserted therein after the words "at or below that depth" in the paragraph above quoted :

"Also except in such part of the chapelyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains for the re-interment of such remains as it may be found necessary to remove from the graves in which they are now interred to admit of the enlargement of the chapel." *C. L. Peel.*
