## From Monday October 27. to Thursday October 30. 1690.

Genoua, Ostober 7. N Sunday last the Marquis de Castel Rodrigo parted from hence on a Genouele Ship for Spain. The Galleys of Naples and Sicily are gone home.

Vinice, October 13. By a Vessel from Dalmatia we are assured, that the Captain-General was gone with the Fleet to attack Durazzo. Warsam, October 13. The last Letters from our Army, which are of the 3d initant, inform us, that Colonel Harstall with 800 Foot and 300 Horse, had possessed himself of Soczawa in Valachia, and had begun to fortify it; That the Body of Horse that conducted him thither under the command of the Sieur Zabolickly, was returned to our Camp; and that the whole Army was marching back towards the Niester, in order to repass that River, and to put the Troops into their Winter Quarters, which will be affigned them as near the Frontiers as conveniently may be, as well to secure the Country during the Winter against the Incursions of the Tartars, as that they may be the readier to begin the Campagne early the next year, for the prosecuting the Designs which the advanced Season, and ill Weather, has put a stop to for the present. We have an account from Transilvania, that Count Teckeley had summoned the States of that Country to meet at Alba Julia, and that accordingly some of the smaller Towns, who were not in a condition to refift him, had fent their Deputies thither, and owned him for their Prince; But that the arrival of Prince Louis of Biden, with the Imperial Forces under his command, had given a new turn to things on that fide, and would in all appearance very much break the Measures Teckeley had taken to Establish himself in that Principality. In the mean time we are here not a little concerned at the Progresses of the Turks is Savis, and doubtless they will put this Court upon rigorous Resolutions against the next Campagne, to which their own Interest, as well as the Engagements and Alliance they are entred into with the Emperor, does so much oblige them. rest are to have their Quarters in Suabia.
Francfort, October 25. The last advices from the Palatinate say, that the greatest part of the Saxon Forces were come near to Hailbron, and that the Elector himself was on his return to Dresden. The Dyet of the Suisse Cantons, that was lately held at Baden, is ended, having, as we hear, resolved to maintain their Neutrality, to secure the Pals of Augst, and to protect the Bishoprick of Basle, and the four Forest Towns. The Canton of Birne has a Birdy of Men in a readiness to affist the City of Geneva, in case the French should make any attempt upon it, of which there is some jealousie; and that City has therefore already reinforced their Garison with 3 or 400 Men, fent them by the faid Canton of We have no News from Hungary, fince that of the taking of Be grade, unless it be that the Duke de Croy was drawing what Force he could to-gether, to maintain the Pass of Esfecke. We are in some impatience to hear from Transilvania.

Bruffels, October 25. The Confederate Forces are separated; The Hollanders were encamped yesterday at Genap, and the Brandenburgers at Hall, from whence they will continue their march towards the Meuse. The Troops of Hanouer lye at Grime bergen; to morrow they will pass the Canal at the Burnt Bridge, and thence return home through Kempen and Gelderland. The Brandenburg Regiment of Dragoons, with that of Foot commanded by Prince Philip; and the Regiments of Fagel and Aylua, are come to this place, where they are to remain in Garison. At Leeuwe are 4 Regiments of Foot and two of Horse, at Malines sour of Foot and one of Horse, and in other Places proportionably; And the Troops are so disposed of, that upon any occasion a good Body of them may very quickly be drawn together. The Duke of Luxemburg has put 4000 Men into Courtray, and marched on the 17th with the Forces that remained with him towards Rouselaer. From thence he intended to go to Dixmuyde, Ipres, and Dunkirke, and having visited those places, (the first of which the French now fortify) to return to Flanders.
