

"And whereas the said particular district of Christ Church Lower Nutfield has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the new parish of Christ Church Lower Nutfield should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church Lower Nutfield shall be altered so that all that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Blechingley in the county and diocese aforesaid which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Christ Church Lower Nutfield.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, being:—

"All that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Blechingley (wherein the farm house and buildings belonging to Ham Farm are situate) in the said county and diocese, which portion is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say:— upon the north and upon the east by the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, and upon the south, and upon the west, by the parish of Horley, in the county and diocese aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct

that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventeenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Chrysostom, situate in Park-road, within the limits of the parish of All Saints Birmingham in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of All Saints Birmingham which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Chrysostom, Birmingham.'

"And with the like consent of the said Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified as aforesaid) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend Percival Ewen Wilson, Clerk in Holy Orders the present rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of All Saints Birmingham shall continue to be such rector or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Percival Ewen
