UR Viceroy continues to execute with great Application the orders he has received from the Court of Spain, about fending Supplies both of Men and Money to the Governor of Milan, and we are affured that there will in a short time be remitted to him a very confiderable Sum. The News of the taking of Vallona has been received in these Parts with a great deal of Satisfaction, for that it will very much contribute to the Security of the Navigation of the Golfe, and the Coasts bordering upon it, which were often di-furbed by the Corfairs of Barbary, to whom Vallona was a place of retreat.

Rome, Octob. 7. The Cardinal of Bouillon has uken his leave of the Pope in order to his return to France. And it's faid that the Cardinal d'Estree is to come hither again, to take upon him the care of the Affairs of that Crown, ashe did formerly. On Monday the Pope held a Confiftory, where the Cardinals gave their Voices for the canonizing of three new Saints, which is to be performed on the 16th of this Month. The Cardinal Pamfilio being declared Legat of Bologne, is on his departure thither.

Venice, Octob. 13. Here have been Publick Rejoycings 3 Nights together for the taking of Vallona. The Senate has made the Serjeant-General Spaar, General of their Land Forces with an additional yearly Pention of 1000 Ducats, for his good Services in that occasion. Madrid, Octob. 4. The Government of Madrid being vacant, which is never given but to Men of Quality and great Merits, and that have passed through very Eminent Employments, his Catholick Majesty has conferred the same upen Don Francisco Ronquillo of the Order of Calatraua, and Brother to the Ambassador from this Crown at the Court of England. The Fleet from New Spain is expeeled home towards the end of the next Month, and therefore Orders have been fent to Cadiz to hasten out the 12 Men of War, that are to go and meet them. The last Letters from thence said, that the Marquis d' Arconcel was arrived there from Malaga to take in some Supplies for the Garison of Oran. The report of the Moors having belieged Centa proves a

Zuricke, Octob. 12. This Week came to Schafbausen, under the Conduct of one of the Elector of Brandenburg's Commissaries sabout 700 Vaudois, who formerly retired into his Electoral Highness's Territories, and are now returning home. They defign, feeing the French are become Masters of the Country of Chablais, to pass by the way of Como. Two days ago arrived here another Company of Vaudois from the Country of Wirtemberg, who have been supplied by our Magistrates, and intend likewife to take their way through the State of

Basse, Octob. 19. The resolutions taken by the Suiss Cantons at their late general Dyet at Baden, have been communicated to the Count de Serini, who was fent thither by the Elector of Bevaria, and he is thereupon gone back to give his Electoral Highness an account of the Success of his Commission. The Deputies of Bern made some Proposals at the said Dyet, in favour of the Duke of Savoy, and though it was not then thought fit to proceed upon them, yet it's probable they may occasion another general Meeting. The French have had a delign to raise some new Fortifications near this City. and we know not yet whether they have wholly laid it aside, though the Cantons have declared. that they will not fuffer themselves to be again' imposed upon as they were when the French built their Forts at Humingen, but that they will oppose the same with all their Force. The Canton of Bern keeps 6000 men in a readiness in the Country of Vaux, for the Security of the City of Geneva. The Armies, that lately approached towards our Frontiers, not wishour giving us some allarm, are now preparing to go into their Winter Quarters.

Edinburg, Octob. 25. The Earl of Seaforth and Viscount Donkell are coming under a Guard of Ho: fe to this place. The Viscount Fedrat, with about 20 Officers (of which feveral are faid to be Frenchmen) are carried Prisoners to Aberdeen; There were found in the Castle of Fendret, several hundred Bowles of Meal, with some Ammunition. We hear that another Party of the Highland Rebels have sheltred themselves in an Island within a Lough in Monteeth; and that a Detachement of Their Majeflies Forces will be fent speedily thither to reduce them. We have an account that the two Ships that failed from Leith bound to Innerlochie, with Provisions for the Garison of Fort William, lately built for curbing the Highlanders, were fafely arrived thern.

Hull, Oftob. 25. Here is lately arrived the Fortune, John Peacocke Maffer, from Gortenlurgh, under the Convoy of the Garland, Capt.
