TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcasses to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animals were affected with a contagious or infectious disease, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcasses to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quicklime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.

2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcasses shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

Lambourn Valley Railway (Deviations).
Certificate of the Board of Trade to authorize the Lambourn Valley Railway Company to divert portions of their authorized Railway; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the Lambourn Valley Railway Company have purchased or contracted for the purchase of the lands required for the Deviation Railways hereinafter described and approach roads in connection therewith and have complied with the requirements of the Railways

Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do by this their Certificate, in pursuance of the said Acts, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited as "The Lambourn Valley Railway (Deviations) Certificate, 1890."

Definition of Company.

2. In this Certificate the expression "the Company" means the Lambourn Valley Railway Company.

Power to construct Railways.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Certificate, the Company may, on the lands purchased or contracted to be purchased by them as aforesaid, make and maintain the deviation railways shown on the deposited plans and sections in the lines and according to the levels and within the limits of deviation shown on such plans and sections, with all proper stations, approaches, sidings, works, and conveniences connected therewith.

Description of Works.

The deviation railways and works authorized by this Certificate will be situated in the county of Berks, and are as follows:—

- (1.) A Deviation Railway (No. 1) in the parish of Lambourn, commencing at or near the point marked, 4 furlongs on the centre line of railway shown on the plans referred to in the Lambourn Valley Railway Act, 1883, as having been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Berks

(hereinafter referred to as "the plans of 1883") and terminating at or near the point 1 mile 2 furlongs on the said centre line.

- (2.) A Deviation Railway (No. 2) commencing in the parish of Lambourn, at or near the point marked, 1 mile 4 furlongs on the centre line of railway shown on the plans of 1883, and terminating in the parish of East Garston, at or near the point marked 2 miles 7 furlongs on the said centre line.
- (3.) A Deviation Railway (No. 3) commencing in the parish of Boxford, at or near the point marked 8 miles on the said centre line as shown on the plans of 1883, and terminating in the parish of Speen, at or near the point marked 9 miles 3 furlongs on the same centre line of railway.
- (4.) A Deviation Railway (No. 4) commencing in the parish of Speen, at the point marked 11 miles on the centre line shown on the plans of 1883, and terminating in the parish of Newbury, at the point marked 12 miles on the same centre line of railway.

Inclination of Road.

4. In altering for the purposes of this Certificate the road next hereinafter mentioned the Company may make the same of any inclination not steeper than the inclination hereinafter mentioned in connection therewith (that is to say) :—

Time for Completion.

6. If the Deviation Railways are not completed within two years from the passing of this Certificate then on the expiration of that period the powers by this Certificate granted to the Company for making and completing those railways or otherwise in relation thereto shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as is then completed.

Railway to be part of Railways of the Company.

7. The railways by this certificate authorized shall for the purposes of tolls and charges, and all purposes whatsoever, be part of the railway and undertaking of the Company.

Power to abandon part of authorized Railway.

8. The Company shall abandon the construction of so much of their railway authorized by the Lambourn Valley Railway Act, 1883, as was proposed to be situated between the respective

points of commencement and termination of the deviation railways hereinbefore described.

Saving of Rights of Landowners to Damages for Entry.

9. The abandonment by the Company under the authority of this Certificate of any portion of any railway or works shall not prejudice or affect the right of the owner or occupier of any land to receive compensation for any damage occasioned by the entry of the Company on such lands for the purpose of surveying and taking levels, or probing or boring, to ascertain the nature of the soil or setting out the line of railway, and shall not prejudice or affect the right of the owner or occupier of any land which may have been temporarily occupied by the Company to receive compensation for such temporary occupation, or for any loss, damage, or injury which may have been sustained by such owner or occupier by reason thereof, or of the exercise as regards such lands of any of the powers contained in the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or the Lambourn Valley Railway Acts, 1883 and 1888.

Compensation to Landowners on Abandonment.

10. Where before the passing of this Certificate any contract may have been entered into or notice given by the Company for the purchasing of any land for the purposes of or in relation to any portion of the railway or works authorized to be abandoned by this Certificate the Company shall be released from all liability to purchase or to complete the purchase of any such lands, but notwithstanding full compensation shall be made by the Company to the owners and occupiers or other persons interested in such lands for all injury or damage sustained by them respectively by reason of the purchase not being completed pursuant to the contract or notice, and the amount and application of the compensation shall be determined in manner provided by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as amended by any subsequent Act for determining the amount and application of compensation paid for lands taken under the provisions thereof.

Short Distance Tolls and Charges.

11. During the continuance of any agreement to be entered into for the working or use of the railway, or any part thereof, the railway of the Company and the Great Western Railway shall for the purposes of short distance tolls and charges be considered as one railway, and in estimating the amount of tolls and charges in respect of traffic conveyed partly on the railway of the Company and partly on the Great Western Railway for a less distance than three miles, tolls and charges may only be charged as for three miles, and in respect of passengers, for every mile or fraction of a mile beyond three miles, tolls and charges as for one mile only, and in respect of animals and goods, for every quarter of a mile or fraction of a quarter of a mile beyond three miles, tolls and charges as for a quarter of a mile only, and no other short distance charge shall be made for the conveyance of passengers, animals, or goods partly on the railway of the Company, and partly on the Great Western Railway.

Company not exempted from general Acts.

12. Nothing in this Certificate contained shall exempt the Company or the railway from the provisions of any general Act relating to railways, or the better and more impartial audit of the accounts of Railway Companies now in force, or which may hereafter pass during this or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future revision

or alteration under the authority of Parliament of the maximum rates of fares and charges, or of the rates for small parcels.

Costs of Certificate.

13. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for, obtaining, and passing of this Certificate, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall be paid by the Company.
