TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 23rd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 28th June, 1890, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months after date, at the option of the persons tendering, viz. :— on the 28th September, or 28th December next, or 28th June, 1891, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 24th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than two o'clock, on Saturday, the 28th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the borough of Morley, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the point in Ackroyd-street, at the western extremity of the premises occupied by Messrs. Wilson and Swallow, thence along the north side of Ackroyd-street to Marshall-street, thence along the eastern side of Marshall-street

to the end of that street, and thence along the fence at the northern side of the field occupied by Mr. R. Barron and along the line of the said fence and the fence at the western side of the property occupied by Mr. Charles Dixon and Messrs. Wilson and Swallow to the point of commencement.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Fife to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcasses of seven calves which died at Pittilloch, in the parish of Arrgask, in the occupation of Mr. John Thom, and which carcasses are buried at different places at or near the steading and ground in the immediate neighbourhood of the steading at Pittilloch, subject to the following conditions:—

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcasses to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animals were affected with a contagious or infectious disease, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcasses to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quicklime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.

2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcasses shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
