(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Lancaster comprising the whole of the Local Board district of Whitefield, so much of the Local Board district of Radcliffe as lies to the south of the Bolton-road, so much of the district of Unsworth as lies south of a line drawn from Hampson's Mill to Whittle Brook and to the west of Whittle Brook, the whole of the district of Outwood in the township of Pilkington, and so much of the township of Ainsworth as lies on the south side of the Bolton-road from Smith Fold to the boundary of the borough of Bury,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Barnes, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Thames on the north-west, the Loop Line of the London and South-Western Railway on the south-west, the Beverley Brook on the south-east, the eastern boundary of Barnes Green on the east, and the Footpath on the north-side of Frog Hall, the road leading to Hermitage Lodge, and an imaginary line drawn from the north-eastern corner of the garden of Hermitage Lodge in a westerly direction to the river Thames, inclosing the whole of the St. Ann's Estate in the occupation of the Lyric Club, on the north,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
