exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected

with pleuro-pneumonia.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of June, one

thousand eight hundred and ninety.

SCHEDULE
