Sans Luis Obispo Bay—Flashing Light, and Intended Fog Signal.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 30th June, 1890, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the South-west extreme of San Luis Point, West side of entrance to San Luis Obispo Bay:—

San Luis Obispo Light is a flashing light of the fourth order, showing red and white flashes alternately, with intervals of thirty seconds between the flashes, visible through an arc of about 240° , or approximately from the bearing of E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., through North, to S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. It is elevated 130 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 17 miles.

The lighthouse consists of a square frame tower and black lantern, with keeper's dwelling, painted white, attached at the south-west angle. About 50 yards eastward stands another white dwelling; between and southward of the dwellings is situated the fog signal building, painted white, with two black chimneys. The lighthouse is situated with the extreme of reef off San Luis Point bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distant about $6\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

Approximate position, lat. $35^{\circ} 9' 30''$ N., long. $120^{\circ} 45' 40''$ W.

Also, that the fog signal at San Luis Obispo Lighthouse is not yet completed. Due notice will be given of its establishment.
