(Swine-Fever.) By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),-at Salehurst, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprising the whole of the lands and premises within the boundary commencing from the Robertsbridge National School via the Workhouse Brook to the river Rother, down such river to the foot bridge leading from the Abbey to the Moat Farmhouse, thence by the footpath leading from Higham to Beechhouse, and from Beechhouse by the footpath leading to Church-lane opposite and up to the said Workhouse Brook,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of July, one thousand

eight hundred and ninety.
