THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated June 22, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, reporting that in consequence of the outbreak of cholera in Spain the sanitary authorities at Varna, Bourgas, and Balchik have been instructed to visit all vessels clearing from Spanish ports on and after June 3, and to take such prophylactory measures respecting them as may be thought necessary.
