Whereas by Order made on the 15th day of July, 1884, by the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, then one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds was prohibited by the said Act in the county of Northumberland was varied, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 11th day of August, in each year:

And whereas under section 3 of the said Act, and section 3 (xiii) of the Local Government (England and Wales) Act, 1888, the County Council of Northumberland have applied to me, to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time, during which the killing and taking of the wild birds mentioned in the schedule subjoined is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Northumberland, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of August, in each year:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Acts, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows :-

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of the wild birds mentioned in the schedule subjoined is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Northumberland, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of August, in each year.
