SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising such parts of the township of Giggleswick, in the West Riding of the county of York, as are comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the junction of the highway from Giggleswick to Rathmell at the Four-lane Ends and along the said highway towards Rathmell to a point where the northern fence of New Hall Farm adjoins such highway, thence along the northern boundary of the said Farm in a westwardly direction past Stubbins Barn to Lumb Homestead, thence by the northern boundary of that Homestead to Cocket-lane, thence along Cocket-lane in a westwardly direction to the western fences of Rome Bank Pasture and Bank Pasture, thence by the northern fence of Bank Pasture to Storth Gill-lane, thence along Storth Gill-lane to Killsticks-lane, thence by Killsticks-lane and the north-western fence of Greenfield Pasture to the Lawkland-road, thence along the Lawkland-road to its junction with High Ridge-lane, thence by High Ridge-lane to the village of Giggleswick and along the Rathmell-road past the Union Workhouse to the Four-lane Ends first above mentioned, but excluding from such Area all the said roads, lanes, and railways forming the said boundary.
