

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant to the respective Incumbents for the time being of the benefices situate within the original limits of the parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which are named in the schedule hereunto annexed, the several sums, the amounts of which are set opposite to the names of the said benefices respectively in the second column of the same schedule, the said sums to be payable out of the common fund under our control, for and in respect of the year ending the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, in equal moieties, one such moiety to be receivable on the first day of November now next ensuing, and the other on the first day of May following.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a certain piece or parcel of land, comprising one acre or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured to the vicarage of Pentir-cum-Glasinfryn, in the county of Carnarvon, and in the diocese of Bangor, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven,

sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Pentir-cum-Glasinfryn, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of two hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Pentir-cum-Glasinfryn.
