The City of Ganeva has been at last personal dead to receive into Garison 300 Men more from the Canton of Boate, so that there are now soon affers, of which 400 are to be maintained by the sid Canton, and ace by that of Zurick; and besides these, the Magistrates of Geneva are going to raise 200, and a good number of Men will be kept in a readiness into the Town whenever there is need of it.
