No. 402.—PACIFIC AND SOUTH-EAST AMERICAN STATIONS.

SOUTH AMERICA—EAST COAST.—PORT OF ST. ELENA.

Sunken Rock Southward of Peninsula of St. Elena. INFORMATION has been received, from the Senior Naval Officer on the South-east Coast of America Station, of the existence of a sunken rock southward of the Peninsula of St. Elena, Port of St. Elena:—

This rock (Cleopatra Rock) has a depth of about two fathoms on it at low water, and is situated with the summit of the Peninsula of St. Elena bearing N.N.W. distant four cables; and Ascortada Islet about E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

The position of this rock is doubtful, and vessels approaching the anchorage at the Port of St. Elena should exercise caution.

Approximate position, lat. $44^{\circ} 31\frac{1}{4}'$ S., long. $65^{\circ} 21\frac{3}{4}'$ W.

RED SEA—WESTERN SHORE.—NORTHERN APPROACH TO SAWAKIN.

Beacon in course of Erection on North Extreme of North Towartit Reef.

INFORMATION has been received from the Commander-in-Chief on the Mediterranean Station, that a beacon is in course of erection on the northern extreme of North Towartit Reef, northern approach to Sawákin:—

North Towartit Reef Beacon will be constructed of masonry, and surmounted by a staff with crossed bars at the top; the masonry will be 16 feet, and the entire beacon 30 feet in height. It will probably be completed on about 1st September, 1890.

Position, lat. $19^{\circ} 31' 45''$ N., long. $37^{\circ} 49'$ E.

MEDITERRANEAN—FRANCE—SOUTH COAST.

Mentone—Intended Alterations in Lights.

THE French Government has given notice that, on 10th August, 1890, a light will be exhibited from the head of the pier, Mentone, and that on the same date the lights shown from the Vieille Tour and Garavan beach, Mentone, will be discontinued:—

Mentone Light will be a fixed white light, elevated 52 feet above the sea.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, or by lenses, of the fifth order.
