

## (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the fields known as Further Hill, Middle Hill, First Hill, Nightingales, and Long Shot Meadow, together with the buildings, at Eastcott Farm, Ruislip, in the county of Middlesex, in the occupation of Mr. George Bishop,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

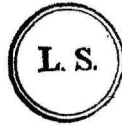

The following Place (namely),—at Sutton, in the county of Stafford, comprising the whole of Warton Grange Farm in the occupation of Mrs. Jane Mason, and so much of Sutton House Farm in the occupation of Mr. Thomas Booker as is bounded by the lane leading from the Newport and Eccleshall-road past Sutton House to the Shropshire Union Canal at Staff Bridge, thence by the said Canal to Shipley-lane, and thence by the Shipley-lane and the Newport and Eccleshall-road to the lane first-mentioned,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. The following Place (namely),—the whole of Warton Grange Farm in the occupation of Mrs. Jane Mason, and so much of Sutton House Farm in the occupation of Mr. Thomas Booker as is bounded by the lane leading from the Newport and Eccleshall-road past Sutton House to the Shropshire Union Canal at Staff Bridge, thence by the said Canal to Shipley-lane, and thence by the Shipley-lane and the Newport and Eccleshall-road to the lane first-mentioned,—which was declared by order of the Executive Committee of the Local Authority of the county of Stafford dated the thirteenth day of September,

one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

The following Places (namely),—(1.) in the township of Glusburn, in the parish of Kildwick, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprising the fields known as Back Meadow, Middle Meadow, Far Pasture, and Near Pasture, together with the Back Croft, and buildings known as Study Farm, in the occupation of Mr. Thomas Green, and also comprising the adjoining fields known as Litch Dunnyroyd and Dunnyroyd, in the occupation respectively of Mr. Henry Stirk and Mr. William Boothman, and (2.) in the township of Glusburn, in the parish of Kildwick, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprising the fields known as Sixday Work and Fourday Work fields, together with the buildings known as White Bear Farm, in the occupation of Mr. William Boothman of Cross Hills, which were declared by Orders of the Board dated the twenty-second and twenty-third days of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, respectively, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
