TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 6th day of June, 1887, relating to the transmission of Parcels between the United Kingdom and Natal, and so much of the Warrants of the said Com-

missioners, dated respectively the 22nd day of October, 1888, and the 14th day of February, 1889, as relates to the transmission of Parcels by way of the United Kingdom between Natal and any British colony or foreign country, shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled.

Definition.

2. In this Warrant:—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the
