(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the Farm buildings, the Basin field, the Near Coppice, the Far Coppice, the Crow field, and the Barn field, being parts of the Salwick Hall Farm, Clifton-with-Salwick, in the county of Lancaster,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—at Damside, Gorgie, Midlothian, comprising the byre and premises occupied by Mr. Peter Fisher and Mr. Donald Fisher, situate on the south side of Gorgie-road,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

SCHEDULE.

A Place in the parish of Barking, in the county of Essex, comprising all the marshes and premises in the occupation of Mr. Merritt, together with the marsh in the occupation of Mr. Kirk, and enclosed within the following boundary, that is to say, from the Thatched House Inn on the Ripple-side-road, and following the said road but not including such road to the north-east corner of the Water Dyke which is Mr. Merritt's boundary, thence following the said Dyke southerly to the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway, thence following the said Railway westerly to the corner of the Private-road to the Thatched House, and thence by the said road northerly to the point of commencement.
