FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

41 Vict., c. 16, s. 53.

OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M., and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

(1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and

(2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than five days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months:

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section:

And whereas Part 2 of the same Act, section 63, provides as follows:

Where it appears to a Secretary of State that the adoption of any special means or provision for the cleanliness or ventilation of a factory or workshop is required for the protection of the health of any child, young person, or woman employed, in pursuance of an exception under this part of this Act, either for a longer period than is otherwise allowed by this Act, or at night, he may by order made under this part of this Act direct that the adoption of such means or provision shall be a condition of such employment:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the non-textile factories of the class mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby, provided that it be subject to the condition hereinafter appearing.

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly: Provided that it shall be a condition of the employment of any young person or woman under this extended exception that there shall be a cubic space of at least four hundred feet for every young person and woman so employed.

This Order shall come into effect on the 17th October, 1890, and shall continue in force until revoked.

ORDER OF 1889, AMENDMENT No. 4.**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Exemption from Muzzling of Dogs with Collars
&c. in certain Districts.*

1. The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889 shall in its application to the Districts of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order be read and have effect as if the following paragraph were inserted at the end of Article 6 (*Muzzling of Dogs*) of the said Order of 1889, namely

(c.) Dogs which have on a collar with the name and address of the owner of the dog legibly engraved on such collar.

and the requirements as to muzzling contained in the said Article 6 shall not apply to such dogs as aforesaid in those Districts.

*Saving as to Application of the Muzzling Order
in other Districts.*

2. Nothing in this Order shall in any way amend or affect The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, in its application to any District or part of a District of a Local Authority which is not mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as THE RABIES (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1889, AMENDMENT No. 4.

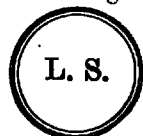

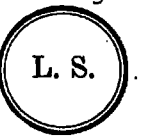
