The KING's Most Excellent MAJESTY in Council.

Hereas His Mujesty has thought fit to Regulate the Number of Ships and English Mariners allowed to go out this year to the Plantations, East-Indies, Africa, Spain, and Pottugal, according to such List of Ships and Mariners cleared Outwards as fall be transmitted from this Board to the Right Honourable the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of England and Commissioners of the Cufform. His Majesty in Council is hereby pleased to Order and Declare, that no more Ships or English Mariners than are entained in such Lists be permitted to go to those Parts som any pretence what soever until surther Order; And that if upon search to be made by the Captains of the Convoys, and others appointed by the Jaid Commissioners of the Admiralty, any more English Mariners be found on Board any Ship or Ships so permitted to go out, such English Mariners exceeding the number allowed by His Majesty, and already given in apon clearing to the Officers of the Customs, shall not only be taken from on board such Ship or Ships, but a Stop or Embargo laid, as it is hereby directed to be laid upon the same, whereof all Persons whom it may some or take notice at their Peril.

Lubon, October 3. The last week arrived in this River the two Fleets from the Bay de Todos los Sanctos, and from Pharnambuco, having on board about 12000 Chefts of Sugar, and 18000 Rolls of Tobacco. By these Ships we have an account, that two French East-India Men, with a small Frigat homeward bound, were come into that Bay, and had fent an advice Boat to France, with the news of their arrival there; The faid Ships were in a very ill condition, having loft most of their Men, and those that were left alive were very fickly, fo that they could not pursue their Voyage without a fresh supply. We hear this morning, that the Ships from Rio de Gemero are safely arrived in the River.

Madrid, Ollober 20. Their Catholick Majesties

went this day to the Escurial, where they intend to flay till the 2d of the next month; and in the mean timegreat preparations are making for the Celebration of the Kings Birth-Day on the 6th, when his Majesty will compleat his Thirtieth year. The Prince of Vaudemont, General of the Horse in the Spanish Netherlands, has obtained leave to go to Italy, to make use of the Baths there, for the recovery of his health; and Count d'Egmont, who is at present at this Court, is appointed to take upon him that command during his absence. We have advice from Part St. Anthony, that on the 10th Instant 3 great Spanish Men of War, one of 92 Guns and 1000 Men, and the other two of 70 Guns, sailed from thence for Cadiz, to join the other nine Men of War that lay ready in that Bay, being all defigned to go and uset the New Spain Fleet that's shortly expectable. en home. They write from se. Sebaftian, that one

of their Privateers of 8 Guns, 8 Pateretoes, and 85 Men, had brought in there a French Vessel of 166 Tuns, bound from Ireland to France; Sho had on board three Companies of Soldiers, who together made but 75 Men. The Vessel carried fix Guns, and four Patereroes, and in the defence she made the Captain and Master, with a Captain of one of the Companies, were killed; and on board the Privateer

the Captain was wounded, and two Men killed.

Warfam, October 21. The Letters from Lemberg of the 12th Instant say, that the Army of this Crown had repassed the Neister, and was come to a place called Dobrowdy, where a general Muster would be taken on the 14th or 15th; and after that the Forces would separate and march to their Winter-quarters, which would be affigned the Troops of Poland in the Province of Volhicia, that they might be the readier at hand to oppose the Incursions of the Tartars during the Winter, but that those of Lithuania would return home. The King of Poiand, who has been some time with the whole Court at Jawarow, was expected on Saturday last at Zalkiew, where it's believed he will continue till towards the end of the next month, and then return There is a discourse as if a Dyet would be called to meet here in January or February, in order to make the necessary provision for an early Campagne the next year.
