Two fixed white lights, visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles, are shown from beacons at Motueka Harbour entrance, and a fixed red light on the wharf at that place.

Approximate position, lat. $41^{\circ} 8' S.$, long. $173^{\circ} 4' E.$

NOTE.—The channel into Motueka Harbour is marked by stakes, carrying red flags on the star-board hand entering, and white flags on the port hand.

HONG KONG APPROACH—KAIPONG ISLANDS.

Intended Flashing Light on Gap Rock.

INFORMATION has been received, of the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse now in course of construction on Gap Rock (Man ni Chau), the south-west rock of the Kaipong Islands, and in the approach to Hong Kong from the southward:—

Gap Rock Light will be a flashing white light, elevated 141 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 21 miles.

Approximate position, lat. $21^{\circ} 48' 40'' N.$, long. $113^{\circ} 56' 20'' E.$

CAUTION.—As none of the small islands lying outside Hong Kong have been closely surveyed, no vessels should approach them within a mile.

Ayr Point—Re-exhibition of Permanent Light, and Discontinuance of Provisional Light.

Ayr Point Permanent Light is a revolving light every minute, showing white and red alternately, elevated 106 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles.
