If the said Guardians shall so direct, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to the Guardians to prepare for printing a copy of the Minutes of each ordinary or other Meeting of the Guardians, and to send to each Guardian, by post or otherwise, forty-eight hours at least before each ordinary Meeting of the Guardians; a printed copy of the Minutes of the last ordinary Meeting and of every other Meeting of the Guardians held since the last ordinary Meeting; and if, in pursuance of any such direction, a printed copy of such Minutes shall have been so sent to each Guardian it shall not be necessary that the Minutes so sent shall be read at the next ordinary Meeting if at such Meeting the Guardians resolve that such Minutes be taken as read. Any such Resolution shall be entered upon the Minutes in lieu of an entry to the effect that the Minutes have been read.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Places (namely),—(1) the fields and sheds of Castleton Cottage Farm, in the parish of Castleton, in the county of Lancaster, in the occupation of Mr. J. Nixon, and (2) Barton Fold Farm, near Bolton, in the parish of Lostock, in the county of Lancaster, in the occupation of Mr. William Gregory,—which were declared by Orders of the Board of Agriculture dated respectively the seventeenth and twentieth days of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. The following Places (namely),—(1) the premises belonging to Mr. John Nixon, at Castleton Cottage Farm, Castleton, near Rochdale, in the county of Lancaster, and (2) the premises belonging to Mr. William Gregory at Barton Fold Farm, Lostock, in the county of Lancaster,—which were declared by orders of the Executive Committee of the Local Authority for the county of Lancaster dated respectively the eighteenth and twenty-first days of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

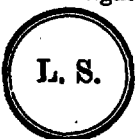
