THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

A Place comprising the byres, yard, and sheds in East Silver Mills-lane, in the parish of St. Cuthberts, in the burgh of Edinburgh, in the occupation of Mr. Samuel Cowan.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby license the Local Authority for the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull to destroy, under Article 95 of The Animals Order of 1886 the carcasses of Animals, Horses, Asses, or Mules

(a.) that have died of pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, sheep-pox, sheep-scab, glanders, farcy, or swine-fever;

(b.) that have been slaughtered in consequence of being affected with sheep-pox, glanders, farcy, or swine-fever;

the same to be destroyed in manner therein prescribed, at the following place (that is to say):—

At certain premises known as the Refuse Destructor, situate in Chapman-street, in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull.

This Licence is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.
