CHINA—EAST COAST.—CHUSAN ARCHIPELAGO.
Non-Existence of East Rock.

THE following information has been received from Commander L. S. Dawson, H.M. surveying ship "Rambler," relative to an unsuccessful search, made in December, 1890, for East Rock, charted as lying with East Islet, bearing W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles:—

The recent search for East Rock was made under favourable conditions of weather, with a considerable swell running, rendering it impossible that a rock awash (as East Rock has been supposed to be), or even with 9 feet of water on it, could escape detection. A quadrilateral area, about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles in extent, over and around the reported position of the rock, was closely sounded, showing a level bottom with general depths of 12 to 13 fathoms, over mud; a careful look out was kept from the deck and aloft; but no indication of shoal water was observed.

Consequent on the foregoing, and from information previously received from Commander Dawson as to the probable non-existence of East Rock, also from consideration of the original evidence of its existence, it has been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

WEST INDIES.—GUADELOUPE.

Ste. Marie Anchorage.—Harbour Lights.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 158 (2) of 1888, and previous notice, on harbour lights at Ste. Marie Anchorage, east coast of Guadeloupe:—

The following information has been received through the Board of Trade, relative to the harbour lights now exhibited at that place:—

1. The light-buoy, with red light, at the northern entrance to Ste. Marie Anchorage, has been withdrawn.

2. A fixed red light is shown from a mast, about 39 feet high, on the inner end of the wharf at Ste. Marie.

Approximate position, lat. 16° 6' N., long. 61° 33' W.

3. A fixed white light of small power is shown from a post, about 11 feet high, on the reef at the inner entrance to Ste. Marie Anchorage.

NOTE.—There is no buoy in the anchorage for the use of vessels getting under way.
