FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

NEWLAND STREET AND CHIPPING HILL FAIRS, WITHAM.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:—

i. By Memorial, dated the 19th day of February, 1891, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices acting in and for the Witham Pctty Sessional Division of the county of Essex, that Fairs have been annually held in Newland Street and Chipping Hill, both in the parish of Witham, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished:

2. On the 31st day of March, 1891, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fairs.

EXCHEQUER BILLS.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice to the holders of Exchequer Bills issued under the authority of the Act 29 V., c. 25, and dated the 11th March, 1887, that the interest thereon for the half year ending on the 11th March, 1891, will be payable at the Bank of England on and after the 11th March next; and that the interest of such Exchequer Bills for the following half year to 11th September, 1891, will be at the rate of Two and three quarters per centum per annum.

All holders of Exchequer Bills dated the 11th March, 1887, who intend to demand payment of the principal sums therein contained at the expiration of the fourth year of their currency, must leave the said Bills at the Bank of England for examination, not later than the 8th March next, between the hours of ten and two; and payment of the said principal sums will be made at the Bank on and after the 11th day of March next.
