

that it was expedient to alter the form and effect of the said Statutes.

Now therefore we the Governing Body of Charterhouse School aforesaid do hereby alter the form and effect of the said Statutes.

The said Statutes as proposed to be amended, will be in the terms following:—

8. At least three calendar months before the examination for Junior Scholarships in each year, public notice shall be given of the number of vacancies in the Junior Scholarships to be filled up at the next election and of the time within which and of the person to whom the names of applicants to become candidates for the same are to be sent in. The candidates shall be submitted to a competitive examination according to the result of which the Scholarships shall be bestowed as hereinafter provided. Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governing Body if it appear to them that any successful candidate is in point of circumstances not fit to receive the aid of an endowment to withhold from the Scholarship to which such candidate shall have been elected the payment of sixty pounds per annum hereinbefore mentioned. In such case the said sixty pounds per annum shall be at the disposal of the Governing Body to be by them applied in aid of the education of any other deserving candidate or any boy or boys in the School who may seem to the Governing Body to need such aid.

9. The examination for Junior Scholarships shall be in Greek, Latin, French, Algebra, Euclid, Arithmetic, and English, writing from dictation, and in such other subjects as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine and shall be conducted by such examiners and be held at such time as the Governing Body shall from time to time fix.
