His Inverial Majesty having been made acquainted with the Conclusion of the States affembed here, on the 29th of August last, concerning the Dutchy of Lorraine, and having well considered the Contents thereof, does not only think it reasonable, and for the common Goed of the Empire, but likewise looks upon himself to be obliged, together with the whole Empire, as well in consideration of the several Treaties and Alliances established between the Empire and the House of Lorraine, as of the extraordinary Services done to his Imperial Majesty, the Empire, and all Christendom, by the late Duke of Lorraine, to procure to his Heirs and Successors, Dukes of Lor-taine and Bart, a full Restitution of all the Dutchies and Lands, of which they are unjustly dispossessed by the Crown of France, with Reparation for the Damages and Loffes they have fustained; and to that end, that the Ministers of Lorraine, when a Treaty of Peace street the fet on foct, shall be admitted thereinto, and furnished with the necessary Passports. And therefore his Imperial Majesty does confirm and strengthen with his Imperial Authority the Said Conclusion of
