## TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 7th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 4, to the amount of £1,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 13th May, 1891, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date, at the option of the persons tendering, viz.:—on the 13th August or 13th November next, or 13th May, 1892, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Friday, the 8th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Wednesday, the 13th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namefy),—the whole of the lands and buildings known as Cold Harbour Farm, Chislehurst, in the county of Kent,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the fourth day of February, one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-one, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

## (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA SCHEDULED DISTRICT.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, declaring part of Fifeshire with the burghs of Dunfermline and Kirkcaldy to be a Pleuro - Pneumonia Scheduled District: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date when this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order, before the date when this Order takes effect.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

## (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA SCHEDULED DISTRICT.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Revocation of Orders.*

1. The Order of the Board of Agriculture dated the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, declaring the city of London and the Metropolitan Police District to be a Pleuro-Pneumonia Scheduled District, and the Order dated the third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, extending that District, are hereby revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Orders, or either of them, before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect
