THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice, dated 22nd March, from the High Commissioner of Cyprus, to the following effect, viz. :—

(1.) "All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus, except the port of Larnaca, from any part of the coast of Arabia from Let to Loheya, and including those places, unless they have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port, and are provided with a clean bill of health, shall be repelled.

(2.) "Vessels arriving at the port of Larnaca from any part of the coast of Arabia from Let to Loheya, and including those places, unless they have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port and are provided with a clean bill of health, shall be subjected to quarantine of five clear days."
