Lancashire, Derbyshire, and East Coast Railway Bill.

(Alteration of Work.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that during the progress through the House of Commons of the Bill bearing the above name or short title an alteration or deviation has been made in the line and levels of a portion of Railway No. 25, described in and proposed to be authorized by the said Bill.

The alteration or deviation will be situate in the Parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, and commence in the parish of Well, at or near the point on the said Railway No. 25 marked 21 miles 4 furlongs on the deposited plans referred to in the said Bill, and terminate in the parish of Bilsby at or near the point on the same railway marked 23 miles 4 furlongs on the said deposited plans. Such alteration or deviation will pass from, in, through, or into, or be situated within, the parish of Well, parish and township of Alford, and the parishes of Farlesthorne and Bilsby.

The several powers and provisions of the said Bill applicable to the railways therein described will be applicable and apply to and comprise the alteration or deviation of the said Railway No. 25, including the powers to levy tolls and purchase lands and houses compulsorily and by agreement.

A plan and section of the beforementioned alteration or deviation of the said Railway No. 25, showing the line and levels thereof, with a book of reference to the plan, and a copy of this notice will, on or before the 13th day of May instant, be deposited for public inspection in the office of the Clerk of the Parliaments, House of Lords, in the Private Bill Office, House of Commons, and with the Clerk of the Peace of the Parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, at his office at Lincoln, and with the parish clerks of each of the aforesaid parishes of Well, Alford,
