REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS the territories of South Africa situate within the limits of this Order, as hereinafter described, are under the protection of Her Majesty the Queen :

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means Her Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the said territories :

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

I. The limits of this Order are :—the parts of South Africa bounded by British Bechuanaland the German Protectorate, the Rivers Chobe and Zambesi, the Portuguese Possessions, and the South African Republic.

II. The High Commissioner may on Her Majesty's behalf exercise all powers and jurisdiction which Her Majesty, at any time before or after the date of this Order, had or may have within the limits of this Order, and to that end may take or cause to be taken all such measures, and may do or cause to be done all such matters and things within the limits of this Order as are lawful, and as in the interest of Her Majesty's service he may think expedient, subject to such instructions as he may from time to time receive from Her Majesty or through a Secretary of State.

III. The High Commissioner may appoint so many fit persons as in the interest of Her Majesty's Service he may think necessary to be Deputy Commissioners, or Resident Commissioners, or Assistant Commissioners, or Judges, Magistrates, or other officers, and may define from time to time the districts within which such officers shall respectively discharge their functions.

Every such officer may exercise such powers and authorities as the High Commissioner may assign to him, subject nevertheless to such directions and instructions as the High Commissioner may from time to time think fit to give him. The appointment of such officers shall not abridge,

alter, or affect the right of the High Commissioner to execute and discharge all the powers and authorities hereby conferred upon him.

The High Commissioner may remove any officer so appointed.

IV. In the exercise of the powers and authorities hereby conferred upon him, the High Commissioner may, amongst other things, from time to time by Proclamation provide for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order, and good government of all persons within the limits of this Order, including the prohibition and punishment of acts tending to disturb the public peace.

The High Commissioner in issuing such Proclamations shall respect any native laws or customs by which the civil relations of any native chiefs, tribes, or populations under Her Majesty's protection are now regulated, except so far as the same may be incompatible with the due exercise of Her Majesty's power and jurisdiction.

V. Every Proclamation of the High Commissioner shall be published in the Gazette, and shall, from and after the expiration of one month from the commencement of such publication, and thereafter until disallowed by Her Majesty or repealed or modified by any subsequent Proclamation, have effect as if contained in this Order.

VI. Her Majesty may disallow any such Proclamation wholly or in part, and may signify such disallowance through a Secretary of State, and upon such disallowance being publicly notified by the High Commissioner in the Gazette the provisions so disallowed shall, one month after such publication, cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything theretofore lawfully done thereunder.

VII. The Courts of British Bechuanaland shall have in respect of matters occurring within the limits of this Order the same jurisdiction, civil and criminal, original and appellate, as they respectively possess from time to time in respect of matters occurring within British Bechuanaland, and the judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences of any such Court made or given in the exercise of the jurisdiction hereby conferred may be enforced and executed, and appeals therefrom may be had and prosecuted in the same way as if the judgment, decree, order, or sentence had been made or given under the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court.

But the jurisdiction hereby conferred shall only be exercised by such Courts, and in such manner and to such extent, as the Governor of British Bechuanaland shall by proclamation from time to time direct.

VIII. Subject to any Proclamation made under this Order any jurisdiction exercisable otherwise than under this Order, whether by virtue of any Statute or Order in Council, or of any Treaty, or otherwise, and whether exercisable by Her Majesty, or by any person on Her behalf, or by any Colonial or other Court, or under any Commission, or under any Charter granted by Her Majesty, shall remain in full force.

IX. Judicial notice shall be taken of this Order, and of the commencement thereof, and of any Proclamation made under this Order, and published in the Gazette, and of any Treaties affecting the territories within the limits of this Order, and published in the Gazette, or contained in papers presented to both Houses of Parliament by command of Her Majesty.

X. This Order shall be published in the Gazette, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation; and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order

at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the limits of this Order.

XI. The Orders in Council of the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, for the establishment of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction in Bechuanaland, and of the thirtieth day of June one thousand eight hundred and ninety, providing for the exercise of Her Majesty's jurisdiction in certain Territories in South Africa, shall continue in force until the commencement of this Order and be thereupon revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and any Proclamation theretofore issued under the said Orders shall continue in operation until repealed or altered by any Proclamation of the High Commissioner under this Order.

XII. Her Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

XIII. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires,—

"Her Majesty" includes Her Majesty's heirs and successors.

"Secretary of State" means one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

"High Commissioner" means Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the time being for South Africa.

"Treaty" includes any existing or future Treaty, Convention, or Agreement between Her Majesty and any civilized Power, or any native tribe, people, Chief, or King, and any Regulation appended to any such Treaty, Convention, or Agreement.

"Gazette" means any official Gazette published by authority of the High Commissioner, and until such Gazette is instituted, means the Cape of Good Hope Government Gazette.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act, 1869," it is (amongst other things) enacted that, where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the examination of, and grant of Certificates of Competency to, persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualification and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons, and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts;
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to Certificates of Competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the Certificates referred to in the said Order;
3. To impose such conditions and to make such

regulations with respect to the said Certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall, from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid :

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, it is provided that Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made by Her under the Merchant Shipping Acts :

And whereas by the Order in Council of the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, Her Majesty was pleased to declare that, subject to certain exceptions, conditions, and regulations therein contained or set out in the Schedule thereto, the Colonial Certificates granted as follows, viz. :—

1. On or after the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada, to persons intending to act as Masters or Mates on board British ships ;
2. On and after the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, by the head of the Government of the Possession of Malta and its Dependencies, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships, that is to say :— To Masters of the First Class, or Masters of a Foreign-going ship, to Mates of the First Class or First Mate of a Foreign-going ship, to Mates of the Second Class or Second Mate of a Foreign-going ship, to Engineers of the First Class or First Class Engineers, and to Engineers of the Second Class or Second Class Engineers ;
3. On and after the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers of British sea-going steamships ;
4. On and after the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, by the Governor for the time being of the Possession of New Zealand, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers, on board British ships ;
5. On and after the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, by the Marine Board of the Possession of New South Wales, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, or Second Mates, or as First Class Engineers, or as Second Class Engineers on board British ships ;
6. On and after the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, by the Marine Board of the Possession of South Australia, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, Only Mates, or Second Mates, or First Class Engineers, or Second Class Engineers on board British ships ;
7. On and after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, by the Governor of the Possession of Tasmania, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;
8. On and after the twenty-seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and

seventy-six, by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Possession of Bengal, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

9. On and after the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, by the Governor of the Possession of Newfoundland, to persons intending to act as Masters or Mates on board British ships ;
10. On and after the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, by the Governor of the Possession of Bombay to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;
11. On and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, by the Marine Board of the Possession of Queensland, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;
12. On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, by the Governor of the Possession of Hong Kong to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;
13. On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the Possession of Canada, to persons intending to act as First Class Engineers or Second Class Engineers of sea-going British ships ;
14. On and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, by the Governor of the Possession of the Straits Settlements, to persons intending to act as First Class Engineers and Second Class Engineers of sea-going British ships ;

And whereas by the Order in Council of the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, Her Majesty was pleased to declare that, subject to certain exceptions, conditions, and regulations therein contained or set out in the Schedule thereto, the Colonial Certificates granted

15. On and after the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, by the Governor of the Possession of the Straits Settlements, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, and Second Mates of sea-going British ships ;

And whereas by the Order in Council of the twenty-second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, Her Majesty was pleased to declare that, subject to certain exceptions, conditions, and regulations therein contained or set out in the Schedule thereto, the Colonial Certificates granted

16. On and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, by the Governor of the Possession of Mauritius, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, and Second Mates, of sea-going British ships ;

should be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts, and subject to the conditions and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Trade, and set out in the Schedules to the said recited Orders in Council respectively :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the conditions and regulations set out in the said recited Orders in Council and the Schedules thereto should be rescinded and the said recited Orders in Council revoked, and a new Order in Council containing such modified and amended conditions and regulations substituted in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the

advice and consent of Her Privy Council, is hereby pleased—

1. To declare that the Colonial Certificates of Competency granted—

(a) by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada, from and after the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, to persons intending to act as Masters or Mates on board British ships, and from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to persons intending to act as First Class Engineers or Second Class Engineers of sea-going British ships :

(b) by the head of the Government of the Possession of Malta and its Dependencies, from and after the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships, that is to say:—To Masters of the First Class, or Masters of a Foreign-going ship, to Mates of the First Class or First Mate of a Foreign-going ship, to Mates of the Second Class or Second Mate of a Foreign-going ship, to Engineers of the First Class or First Class Engineers, and to Engineers of the Second Class or Second Class Engineers ;

(c) by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Government of the Possession of Victoria, from and after the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers of British sea-going ships :

(d) by the Governor for the time being of the Possession of New Zealand, from and after the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

(e) by the Marine Board of the Possession of New South Wales, from and after the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, or Second Mates, or as First Class Engineers, or as Second Class Engineers on board British ships ;

(f) by the Marine Board of the Possession of South Australia, from and after the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, Only Mates, or Second Mates, or First Class Engineers, or Second Class Engineers on board British ships ;

(g) by the Governor of the Possession of Tasmania, from and after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

(h) by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Possession of Bengal, from and after the twenty-seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

(i) by the Governor of the Possession of Newfoundland, from and after the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, to persons intending to act as Masters or Mates on board British ships ;

(k) by the Governor of the Possession of Bombay, from and after the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-

seven, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

(l) by the Marine Board of the Possession of Queensland, from and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships :

(m) by the Governor of the Possession of Hong Kong, from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships ;

(n) by the Governor of the Possession of the Straits Settlements from and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to persons intending to act as First Class Engineers and Second Class Engineers of sea-going British ships ;

(o) by the Governor of the Possession of the Straits Settlements, from and after the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, and Second Mates of sea-going British ships ;

(p) by the Governor of the Possession of Mauritius, from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to persons intending to act as Masters, First Mates, and Second Mates of sea-going British ships,

shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts :

2. To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to Certificates of Competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except :—

So much of the third sub-section of the twenty-third section of "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," as requires, at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspending of a certificate, such certificate, if cancelled or suspended, to be forwarded to the Board of Trade ; and the whole of the provisions of the fourth sub-section of the same section ;

shall apply to such Colonial Certificates of Competency as are in paragraph 1 of this Order referred to ; provided, however, that in the case of New Zealand the foregoing exceptions shall not interfere with or suspend the operation of an Act of the Legislature of New Zealand, intituled "The Merchant Shipping Act Adoption Act, 1869" (32 and 33 Vict., No. 5) ; and provided that section 139 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and section 10 of "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," shall, for the purpose of their application to such Certificates of Competency as aforesaid, be construed as not referring to the Board of Trade but as referring to the authority mentioned in the interpretation clause of Schedule A to this Order, which granted the Certificate which has been lost or is to be replaced :

3. To impose and make the regulations set out in the Schedule A hereto, numbered 1 to 12 respectively, with respect to the said Colonial Certificates of Competency, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, and to impose for the breach of such regulations the penalties therein mentioned.

4. To revoke the conditions and regulations set out in the Schedules to the said recited Orders in Council, and to substitute therefor the regulations set out in the Schedule A hereto numbered 1 to 12 respectively, and to declare

that, from and after the time when this Order takes effect, the regulations set out in the Schedule A hereto shall apply to all Colonial Certificates that may heretofore have been or shall be hereafter granted as aforesaid.

5. To declare that this Order shall take effect in the said Possessions respectively which are enumerated in the Schedule B hereto immediately from and after the publication of this Order in such Possessions respectively, and that all Certificates granted in the said Possessions subsequently to the dates named in the Schedule B, and before this Order comes into force, shall have the same effect, and be of the same value, and confer the same privileges on the holders thereof as if granted after this present Order :

6. To direct that the said hereinbefore recited Orders in Council shall be revoked in each of the said Possessions on the day on which this Order takes effect therein as provided in the preceding paragraph (5) hereof; provided, however, that the revocation of the said Orders in Council shall not affect or invalidate any Colonial Certificate of Competency previously granted to which the said Orders in Council apply, or affect the validity or invalidity of anything done under the said Orders in Council before this Order takes effect or any obligation heretofore incurred

7. A copy of this Order shall forthwith, after the publication thereof in the London Gazette, be forwarded to the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, or Head of the Government of each of the said enumerated Possessions, who shall, immediately upon the receipt of such copy, publish this Order, and the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Secretary of State for India in Council are hereby required to take order in that behalf.

SCHEDULE A.

REGULATIONS with respect to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension of Colonial Certificates of Competency.

Interpretation Clause.

In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them, that is to say :—

“*Colonial Certificate of Competency*” or “*Colonial Certificate*” shall mean a Certificate of Competency granted under the authority of the Legislature or Legislative Authority of one of the British Possessions in Schedule B hereto mentioned, to persons intending to act or acting as Masters, Mates, or Engineers of British ships.

“*Authority*” shall mean the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, Head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body, or Corporation of or in any British Possession for the time being authorized by the Legislature or Legislative Authority of such Possession to grant Colonial Certificates of Competency.

“*Certificate*” shall mean a Certificate of Competency.

REGULATIONS.

Form of Certificate.

1. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding Certificate of Competency for the Foreign Trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

Name of Possession to be inserted.

2. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall

have the name of the British Possession in which the same is granted inserted prominently on its face and back.

Certificates to be numbered consecutively.

3. The Colonial Certificates of Competency granted in each British Possession shall be numbered in consecutive order.

Lists of Certificates granted, cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.

4. The Authority in each British Possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seamen in London, from time to time, with accurate lists of all such Colonial Certificates of Competency as may be granted therein, or as may, for any cause whatsoever be cancelled, suspended, renewed, or re-issued; and shall also furnish him with duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such Certificates are granted.

Certificates to be granted only upon proof of service at Sea.

5. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall be granted only upon proof that the previous service at sea of the person applying for the same has been such as is required by the regulations for the time being in force in the United Kingdom with respect to Certificates of the like grade.

Certificates of Competency granted contrary to this regulation, or upon any false, incorrect, or insufficient proof, certificate, or report of service, qualification, conduct, or character shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates not to be granted when former are cancelled.

6. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Authority of a British Possession, cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said Acts or of any Act or Ordinance for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, unless—

- (i.) in accordance with Regulation No. 7;
- (ii.) or the same is a Certificate of a lower grade than the one so cancelled or suspended, and is issued upon the recommendation of the Court or Authority which cancelled or suspended the original certificate;
- (iii.) or the period of suspension has expired;
- (iv.) or intimation has been received from the Board of Trade or the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted to the effect that no objection to the grant of such Colonial Certificate is known to exist.

Before a Certificate is returned in accordance with sub-section (iii) any certificate which may have been granted temporarily or pending the suspension must be delivered up and it shall be returned to the authority by whom it was granted.

Colonial Certificates of Competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates which may be granted after a Certificate has been cancelled or suspended.

7.—(1.) It shall be lawful for the Governor or person administering the Government of the British Possession in which a Certificate has been cancelled or suspended if, after full investigation of all the circumstances, he thinks the justice of the case requires it;

- (a.) If the Certificate was granted in the Colony, to return the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended, or to shorten the time for which it is suspended, or to grant or request the Authority of the Posses-

sion to grant a Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended.

(b.) If the cancelled or suspended Certificate was granted by the authority of another Colony, to request such authority to return the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended, or to shorten the time for which it is suspended, or to grant a Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended.

(c.) If in the opinion of such Governor or person administering the Government of the British Possession the justice of the case requires the issue of a Colonial Certificate without delay to the person whose Certificate has been cancelled or suspended, the Governor or person administering the Government aforesaid (in addition to acting upon subsection b. of this regulation) to issue or request the authority in such British Possession to issue, a Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended, which substituted Certificate is to be in force for such limited period as such Governor or person administering as aforesaid shall in that behalf direct and no longer.

(d.) If the cancelled or suspended Certificate was granted by the Board of Trade, to issue or request the authority of the Possession to issue a Colonial Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of the cancelled or suspended Certificate, and such substituted Certificate is to be in force for such limited period as such Governor or person administering as aforesaid shall in that behalf direct and no longer; and the Governor or person aforesaid shall also cause the Board of Trade to be informed of his act.

(2.) If a Colonial Certificate is cancelled or suspended in the United Kingdom the Board of Trade may, if in their opinion the justice of the case requires it, return or request the authority by whom such Certificate was granted to return any Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended, or shorten or request such authority to shorten the time for which it was suspended, or request such authority to issue a Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended.

(3.) Whenever the authority by whom a cancelled or suspended Certificate was originally issued is requested by the Governor or person administering the Government of a British Possession in accordance with section (1) of this Regulation; or by the Board of Trade in accordance with section (2) of this Regulation, to return any Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended, or to shorten the time for which it is suspended, or to issue a Certificate of the same or any lower grade in place of any Certificate which has been so cancelled or suspended, the authority so requested as aforesaid shall forthwith return any Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended or shorten the time for which it was suspended, or issue a Certificate accordingly (as the case may be).

(4.) In all cases in which the powers given by this regulation are exercised, a report of the case shall be sent by the Governor or person administering the Possession in which the powers are exercised to the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended Certificate was granted.

Certificates improperly granted may be cancelled; without formal investigation.

8. A Colonial Certificate of Competency which appears from information subsequently acquired, or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, may (without any formal investigation, under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," or the Acts amending the same) be cancelled by the authority by which the same was granted, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, and the holder of such Certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or such authority, or as they or either of them may direct, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the manner in which penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable, or in such other summary proceedings as the law of any British Possession where the holder may be may allow or permit to be brought for the recovery thereof.

Cancellation, &c., of a Certificate shall involve Cancellation of all the other Certificates possessed by its Owner.

9. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a Certificate pronounced by any Board, Court, or Tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts, shall, unless otherwise directed, extend equally to all the Colonial Certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made.

Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.

10. Any Officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his Officers, or a Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office, or a Consular Officer, or duly appointed Shipping Officer in a British Possession, may demand the delivery to him of any Colonial Certificate of Competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such Certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds or its equivalent in local currency, which shall be recoverable in the manner in which penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable, or in such other summary proceedings as the law of any British Possession where such person may be, may allow or permit to be brought for the recovery thereof.

Suspended Certificates to be re-issued only by Colony by which originally granted.

11. Subject to these regulations a Colonial Certificate of Competency which has, from any cause, been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the authority by which the same was originally granted.

Colonial Certificates, when cancelled or suspended, to be sent to the Authority which granted them.

12. Whenever a Colonial Certificate is cancelled or suspended the Board, Court, or Tribunal cancelling or suspending the same shall send to the Authority by whom the Certificate was granted a full report upon the case, together with a copy of the evidence taken therein, and also the Certificate which has been cancelled or suspended.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes: and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested: and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or

"their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas, the Right Reverend Daniel Lewis, Lord Bishop of Bangor, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"To the Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Daniel Lewis Lord Bishop of Bangor do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Anglesey and within my diocese of Bangor the benefice or vicarage of Amlwch which comprises the district of Llanlliana the limits whereof are well known and defined being bounded on the north side by the sea and on the east south and west sides by the parish of Llanbadrig."

"That the said district of Llanlliana is situate four miles from the parish church of Amlwch, but is less than half-a-mile distant from the parish church of Llanbadrig that according to the last census the total population of the said benefice or vicarage of Amlwch with the said district thereto belonging is three thousand five hundred and forty-four and the total population of the said district of Llanlliana is thirty-five or thereabouts."

"That the gross annual income of the said benefice or vicarage of Amlwch amounts to two hundred and eighty pounds or thereabouts."

"That the commuted tithe rent-charge of the said district of Llanlliana amounts to thirty-one pounds nineteen shillings and sixpence or thereabouts."

"That there is no glebe land belonging to the vicarage of Amlwch situate within the said district of Llanlliana."

"That according to the last census the popula-

tion of the vicarage and parish of Llanbadrig is one thousand and sixty-one and the annual income of the said vicarage is one hundred and fifty pounds nett or thereabouts.

"That the patronage or right of collation to the said vicarage of Amlwch with the district of Llanlliana thereto belonging belongs to me in right of my See of Bangor and the Reverend David Lloyd Jones is the incumbent thereof and that the Reverend Thomas Prichard Clerk is the present incumbent and the Lord Chancellor is the present patron of the said vicarage of Llanbadrig.

"That the said vicar of Llanbadrig has proposed to me that the said district of Llanlliana should be separated from the said vicarage and mother church of Amlwch and be annexed to the said vicarage of Llanbadrig and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners have undertaken if such separation and annexation is carried out immediately thereupon to augment the said vicarage of Llanbadrig by the annexation thereto of the yearly tithe commutation rent-charges arising within the said district of Llanlliana.

"That by an order of the Local Government Board dated the fourteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven the said district of Llanlliana was amalgamated with the said parish of Llanbadrig for civil purposes.

"That it appears to me that the said district of Llanlliana may be advantageously separated from the said rectory of Amlwch and annexed to the said vicarage of Llanbadrig for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty cap. one hundred and six, I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto of the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and of the said incumbents of the said vicarages of Llanbadrig and Amlwch respectively I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme, certify the same and such consent by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said district of Llanlliana shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Amlwch and be united and annexed to and become and be deemed for ecclesiastical purposes part and parcel of the said vicarage of Llanbadrig which shall henceforth be styled the vicarage of Llanbadrig and that the said district of Llanlliana shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Llanbadrig and that the incumbent of the said last-mentioned vicarage shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said district of Llanlliana.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings, marriages, burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within or in respect of the said district of Llanlliana shall henceforth belong to the incumbent, clerk and sexton of the said vicarage of Llanbadrig.

"That the patronage or right of presentation to the said vicarage of Llanbadrig shall remain unchanged notwithstanding the annexation thereto of the said district of Llanlliana.

"That the inhabitants of the said district of

Llanlliana shall not be entitled henceforth to any accommodation within the said parish church of Amlwch.

"Given under my hand this nineteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

"I the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and as such the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage or parish church of Llanbadrig in the county of Anglesey in case the same were now vacant and I, the Reverend Thomas Prichard Clerk B.A., the incumbent of the said vicarage of Llanbadrig do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the above described district of Llanlliana and uniting the same to the said vicarage of Llanbadrig and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In witness whereof we have hereunto respectively set our hands this twentieth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

"I the Right Reverend Daniel Lewis by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Bangor and as such the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage and parish church of Amlwch with the district of Llanlliana in the county of Anglesey and within my diocese of Bangor in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend David Lloyd Jones Clerk Vicar of the parish of Amlwch with the district of Llanlliana aforesaid do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the above described district of Llanlliana aforesaid from the said parish of Amlwch and for uniting the same to the vicarage of Llanbadrig in the county of Anglesey aforesaid and to every matter and thing herein contained.

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, by his report dated the twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend Daniel Lewis Lord Bishop of Bangor has represented unto us (amongst other things),—

"That there is in the county of Anglesey and his diocese of Bangor the parish and benefice or vicarage of Amlwch.

"That there is also in the said county and diocese the parish and benefice or vicarage of Llanbadrig.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the district of Llanlliana the limits whereof are well known and defined being an outlying portion of the parish of Amlwch which has already been united to the parish of Llanbadrig for civil pur-

poses may be advantageously separated from the said parish and mother church of Amlwch and annexed to the said parish of Llanbadrig for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter one hundred and six the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction rent-charges dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices to be affected have been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter one hundred and six certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of Her Majesty chapter fourteen duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of Your Majesty chapter fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of

a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Bournemouth within the limits of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Andrew Kinson in the county of Dorset, and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson, of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Peter Bournemouth, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester, and of the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth in the last-named county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and of such district respectively

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson, of the said new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth and of the said district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Harold Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, as such Bishops respectively with the consent of the Right Honourable Ivor Bertie, Baron Wimborne, of Canford Manor, Wimborne, in the said county of Dorset, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson, with the consent of Sir George Eliott Meyrick Tapps Gervis Meyrick of Hinton Admiral in the said county of Southampton, Baronet, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth with the consents of the Reverend Robert James Wilson, Clerk in Holy Orders, Warden of Keble College in the University of Oxford, of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Lincoln, of Henry Hucks Gibbs of Bishopsgate-street in the city of London, Esquire, and of John Archibald Shaw Stewart of number 71, Eaton-place, in the county of Middlesex Esquire, as the patrons of the benefice of the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson, of the said new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth, and of the said district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan herunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Bournemouth' and that such consolidated chapelry should become and be and form part of the said diocese of Winchester and should be included within and form part of the rural deanery of Fordingbridge West and of the archdeaconry of Winchester within the said last-named diocese.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty

will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Bournemouth, being :—

“All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Andrew Kinson, in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury, of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Peter Bournemouth (being an isolated part thereof) in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester and of the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth, in the last-named county and diocese, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said county of Dorset and diocese of Salisbury from the said county of Southampton and diocese of Winchester aforesaid at the point where the respective boundaries of the consolidated chapelry of All Saints Branksome Park in the said county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury aforesaid of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson and of the said isolated part of the new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth aforesaid all meet at or near to the junction of the Poole-road with Prince of Wales-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twelve and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Poole and Bournemouth Railway over the same road and extending thence south-eastward for a distance in all of thirty-six chains or thereabouts first along the middle of the said branch line of railway to its termination at the West Bournemouth Railway Station and then in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to a point in the middle of Queen's-road upon the boundary which divides the said isolated part of the new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth from the new parish of Saint Michael Bournemouth in the said county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester aforesaid, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said Queen's-road) for a distance of fourteen and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the point where such last-mentioned boundary meets the boundary dividing the said isolated part of the new parish of Saint Peter Bournemouth from the district of Saint Stephen Bournemouth aforesaid at the centre of Queen's-road Bridge which carries the said last-mentioned road over the stream called or known as the Bourne and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said streams for a distance of nineteen and a quarter chain) or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Prince of Wales-road aforesaid over the same stream and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three and three quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Branksome Wood road and with a private road leading through Talbot Woods towards Winton and continuing thence still first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of fifty-four and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same road over the Bournemouth Junction branch line of the London and South Western Railway and extending thence westward

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz. :—widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

BARKBY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Barkby, in the county of Leicester; and also in the old part of the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) MORVAL.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Morval, in the county of Cornwall; and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in, and which when opened, are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

In the parish churchyard of East Haddon, in the county of Northampton, until the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

In the parish churchyard of Wickhambrook, in the county of Suffolk, until the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

BRITISH PROTECTORATE OVER NYASSALAND.

IT is hereby notified for public information that, under and by virtue of Agreements with the Native Chiefs, and by other lawful means, the territories in Africa, hereinafter referred to as the Nyassaland Districts, are under the Protectorate of Her Majesty the Queen.

The British Protectorate of the Nyassaland Districts comprises the Territories bounded on the east and south by the Portuguese Dominions; and to the west by a frontier which, starting on the south from the point where the boundary of the Portuguese Dominions is intersected by the boundary of the Conventional Free Trade zone defined in the 1st Article of the Berlin Act, follows that line northwards to the point where it meets the line of the Geographical Congo Basin, defined in the same Article, and thence follows the latter line to the point where it touches the boundary between the British and German spheres, defined in the second paragraph of the 1st Article of the Agreement of the 1st July, 1890.

Measures are in course of preparation for the administration of justice and the maintenance of peace and good order in the Nyassaland districts.
