Naples, November 14.

OUR Viceroy continues his Applications for the assisting the Governor of Milan with Succors of Men and Money, according to the Directions he has received from the Court of Spain. There has within these few days been felt in Calabria several small Earthquakes, but they have done no considerable damage. The Gallies of Sicily are gone home; and three of the Squadron of Turfis are arrived here. Two days ago a Man of War was calt away on this Coast, but the Men, to the number of about 200, were saved; They pretend to have been in the Service of the Venetians, and that they came last from Vallona, but it's rather believed, that they are Corsairs.

Rome, November 18. The Spanish Ambassador had on Saturday last an Audience of the Pope, and the Cardinal Gurtz the next day, to desire that one of the Vacancies in the College of Cardinals might be disposed of at the Emperor's nomination; but on Monday the Pope held a Conistory, where he promoted *Francisco Barberino* and *Lorenzo Altieri* to the Dignity of Cardinals, and at the same time declared *Signor Bartoli* Patriarch of *Alexandria*. The Cardinals in the Imperial and Spanish Interests were not present at this Ceremony; nor did the Ambassador of Spain, or the Emperor's Envoy, make the following Nights the Bonfires and Illuminations that are usual on such occasions. On Tuesday the French Ambassador had an Audience of the Pope, to Compliment him upon this new Promotion; and on Thursday a Publick Conistory was held, in which the Pope gave the new Cardinals their Hats with the accustomed Formalities. Our Gallies that lately returned from the Levant are laid up, but they will go out again early the next Year, with double the number of Land Soldiers, that were sent the last to the assistance of the Venetians. The Pope seems likewise resolved to contribute all that depends on him for a vigorous Prosecution of the War in Hungary, towards which he has already sent a supply of Money, and intends to send more very suddenly.

Milan, November 21. Our Governor is expected here in few days from Piedmont, his Horfes and Baggage being already arrived. We have advice, that the Marquis de la Parella, who lately took *Cratcau Dauphin*, is marched with the Troops under his command towards *Dauphin*.

Lemberg, November 16. The Polish Court is at *Zolkiew*, where a Courier arrived this week with the Treaty of Marriage between the Prince of Poland and the Princess Palatine of *Saxony*, which will be now shortly solemnized,

the Bishop of *Pofnia* going for that purpose Ambassador Extraordinary to the Court of *Neubourg*. The King of *Poland* has summoned a great Council to meet at *Zolkiew*, to consult about the Preparations that are to be made against the next Campaign, and the dispatch of the Tartar Envoy, who arrived there several Months ago with a Commission from the Cham, to offer his Mediation for the making a Peace between this Crown and the Turks. The Tartars have lately put a Convoy of Provisions into *Caminiec*, and have since made a great Ravage on our Frontiers.

Stockholm, November 29. The Count de *Staremberg* Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor arrived here on Sunday last, and has since had a private Audience of the King, and a Conference with his Principal Ministers about the present Juncture of Affairs. It's said, he comes to desire an assistance of several thousand Men against the Turks.

Vienna, November 30. The last Letters from *Esseck* gave an account, that they had sent out several Parties, who went as far as the *Sava* without meeting with any of the Enemies Troops, or learning any other news of them, than that the Grand Visier was retired from *Belgrade*, in order to put his Forces into their Winter Quarters. Prince *Louis* of *Baden* was, by our last advice, advanced with the Imperial Forces under his command to *Samos Vivar*, having sent 4 Regiments before towards *Upper Hungary*, to assist General *Nigrelli*, who had passed himself on the *Theisse* to secure the Bridge of *Zolnecke*, and consequently to hinder the Turks from passing that River. General *Hensler*, who was a Prisoner with *Tockley*, has obtained his liberty, having left two Officers as Hostages for the payment of the Ransom that has been agreed on. The Turks have put strong Garrisons into *Lippa*, *Giula*, *Fenu*, and *Great Waradin*.

Basse, November 30. We are expecting, with some impatience, the return of the Express which the French Ambassador has sent to *Paris*, to acquaint the King his Matter with the last Resolution of the *Suisse Cantons* about the new Works designed at *Hunningen*; to which, a stop is given in the mean time. So soon as this Courier, and that sent to the Emperor, are come back, there will be held another General Dyet at *Baden*, about the Neutrality of the Forest Towns, and the Bishoprick of *Basse*.

Hedelberg, December 4. We are working very hard on the Fortifications of this City, and shall have a very good Garrison here this Winter. The Marquis d'*Ouelles*, who at present commands the French Forces in *Alsace*, is now an *English*, which the French are fortifying; They are likewise making some new Fortifications for the defence of their Bridge of Boats at *Phalsburg*.

Berlin, December 5. Their Electoral Highnesses of *Brandenburg* arrived here last night, but the Elector intends, so soon as he has dispatched some publick affairs, to return towards *Hannover*, and from

thence take his Journey to the *High*. His Electoral Highness will make very considerable Levies this Winter, and has already given out Commissions for 4000 Men.

Monday, December 9. General *Chaussé*, who commanded the Forces of *Hungary* that were employed this Summer on the *Rhine*, is returned to *Strasbourg* where some time since he had been about *Vienna* and *Paris*. We hear from *Strasbourg*, that the *French* had taken leave to take some Seamen in that Port, and to the service of their Fleet, but that the King had absolutely refused it. The Minister of *Strasbourg*, that has resided here some time, is gone home to accept his Electoral Highness with his late Transactions in the business of *Saxony-Lauenburg*.

Tuesday, December 10. The Troops of *Hesse* that remained in these Parts, pulled the *Rhine* two days ago in their march homeward. The *Munster* Troops are entered into their Quarters in the *Essex*, and the *Brandenburgers* have theirs in the *Lower* *Diece*; The Count de *Comminges* is daily expected here, being appointed by the Elector of *Cologne* to reside in this City as President of his Council. They write from *Menz*, that the *French* had drawn a Body of 12 or 14000 Men together about *Keyserlaurenz*, but that after having demolished some small places, which they apprehended the *Imperialists* would possess themselves of, they retired again. In the mean time General *Tanen*, who now commands at *Menz*, continues his care for the putting that place into a very good posture of defence.

Wednesday, December 11. On the 7th instant Their Majesties Ships cruising in the *Soundings* under the command of Sir *Claude Shovel*, discovered a small French Man of War, being a Ship of 15 Guns and 1000 Men. The *Crown* and *Defendant* gave chase to her, and the *Crown* being got up with her, after they had exchanged some Guns, laid her on board, and took her; The French Captain and his Lieutenant were wounded, and his Master with divers of his Men killed. This Chase brought Sir *Claude Shovel* off the Channel as far as the *Lizard*, and the Wind blowing hard at West, he returned into this Port yesterday with the said Prize, which came from *Rouen* about 10 days ago, and was bound to *Brest*, but the Wind put her off the Shore towards *Scilly*. The French Prisoners say, that in the beginning of the Winter a Squadron of 10 or 12 French Men of War sailed to the *Leeward*, and that there lye at *Brest* 12 Ships ready to sail, supposed to be designed for the Coast of *Spain*. That there are no Successors gone from *France* to *Ireland*, unless it be in some small Vessels upon the account of particular Men; And that they look upon their Affairs in that Kingdom to be quite lost. Yesterday came in a Ship of *British* that had been taken in her Voyage to *Virginia* by a French Privateer, but about 6 days after their Majesties Ship the *Perseus* fell in with her, and took her.
