ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Adding Borough to Audit District:—

Surrey Audit District.

Borough of Tunbridge Wells.

To Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe, District Auditor;—

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District within which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed "The Surrey Audit District";

And whereas by Article II of the said Order We ordered and directed that it should be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Authorities specified or referred to in paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) of that Article,

and the Accounts of such of the other Authorities whose Accounts were or might be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction were for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We might, by Order under Seal, thereafter prescribe;

And whereas by certain Orders dated the 5th day of January, and the 25th day of March, 1880, We directed that it should be the duty of the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe to audit the Accounts of the Authorities therein mentioned, including the Accounts of the Local Board for the Local Government District of Tunbridge Wells;

And whereas by Royal Charter dated the 16th day of January, 1889, the said District of Tunbridge Wells was incorporated into a Municipal Borough, with the style and title of the Borough of Tunbridge Wells;

And whereas by Section 272 of the Tunbridge Wells Improvement Act, 1890, it was directed that the Accounts of the Corporation, and of the Borough Treasurer and the Officers of the Corporation, under any public or private Act of Parliament should be audited by the District Auditors appointed by the Local Government Board in like manner as Accounts of an Urban Authority and their Officers under Sections 247 and 250 of The Public Health Act, 1875:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe to audit the Accounts of the Corporation of the said Borough, and of the Borough Treasurer and the Officers of the Corporation, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article III of the first above cited Order, and that for the purposes of such audit the District of the said Borough shall be deemed to be within the said Surrey Audit District.
