JAMES WOOD SMITH, of Macduff, Scotland, Master of the fishing-boat "Lady Matheson."

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

The fishing-smack "Lady Matheson," manned by three men, SMITH (Master), Morrison, and McKay, stranded about midnight on the 1st March, 1891, in a north-west gale and snow-storm, among rocks in 20 feet of water, and about 100 yards from an exposed and dangerous part of the coast at Scarfskerry, Scotland.

SMITH swam ashore, but finding that the others were unable to follow him, he swam back to the boat for a line, which he fastened round his waist, and again returned ashore. Morrison, while preparing to make use of the line, was washed off the boat by the waves, and was only saved from drowning by SMITH, who, hearing his cries, rushed into the surf, and pulled him out. SMITH then called to McKay, but the latter replying that he had lost hold of the line, SMITH again swam out to the boat with the line round his waist, and, finding McKay was unable to use it, fastened him on to himself, and both were hauled ashore by Morrison.

As the result of his exertions on the occasion, SMITH has since been under medical treatment, and unable to pursue his calling.

COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OR  
DAMAGE OF PARCELS.  
TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. On and as from the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and relating to the payment by the Postmaster-General of compensation in respect of the loss or damage of Parcels transmitted by post as therein mentioned, shall extend and apply to Parcels posted in the United Kingdom addressed to British Guiana, or posted in British Guiana addressed to the United Kingdom, as if British Guiana had been mentioned and included amongst the several places specified in the schedule to the said Warrant.

### THE YORK (KNAVESMIRE) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### *Restriction on Movement.*

1.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved on to the Knavesmire in the city of York except as provided by this Order:

(2.) Cattle may be moved for the purpose of grazing on to the Knavesmire with a Licence of a Pasture-Master granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a person qualified according to the Act of 1878 to be such, certifying that each of the cattle described in the

Certificate is in his opinion free from pleuro-pneumonia.

(3.) The Pasture-Master granting the Licence under this Order shall retain the Certificate produced to him and shall forthwith deliver the same to the Local Authority for the city of York or to such person as the Local Authority may direct.

#### *Offences.*

2. If a head of cattle is moved on to the Knavesmire or Scarcroft or Hob Moor in the city of York, in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

#### *Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as THE YORK (KNAVESMIRE) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

#### *Commencement.*

4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

#### *Interpretation.*

5. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Knavesmire means the tract of land situate in the city of York over which the Freemen of Micklegate Ward in that city have rights of pasturage, and includes the adjoining pieces of land called Scarcroft and Hob Moor respectively and over which the said Freemen have the same rights of pasturage.

Pasture-Master means a person who for the time being is a duly elected Pasture-Master of Micklegate Ward Strays (comprising the Knavesmire, Scarcroft, and Hob Moor) in the city of York.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1891.
