HIS HIGHNESS THE BRIDEGROOM.

At 4 o'clock, The Queen, accompanied by Her Royal Highness The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein (Princess Helena of Great Britain and Ireland) and by Their Highnesses The Prince Christian Victor and Princess Victoria of Schleswig-Holstein, left the Queen's Entrance of the Castle and drove to the South Entrance of the Chapel.

The Queen was met there by The Mistress of the Robes, The Duchess of Buccleuch, The Lady of the Bedchamber in Waiting, The Lady Amphill, The Lord in Waiting, The Lord Churchill, The Groom in Waiting, Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Fleetwood I. Edwards, K.C.B., The Equerries in Waiting, General Lynedoch Gardiner, C.B., Major-General Sir Henry Ewart, K.C.B., and by Mrs. G. G. Gordon and Baroness von und zu Egloffstein, Ladies in Attendance on Her Royal Highness The Princess Christian and Her Highness The Princess Victoria of Schleswig-Holstein, who awaited Her Majesty's arrival at the South Entrance.

On arrival The Queen was received by The Lord Chamberlain and The Vice-Chamberlain, who conducted Her Majesty with The Princesses, and followed by the Household in Waiting, to the *Haut Pas*—Handel's Occasional March being played on the Organ.
