ORDER of the Local Government Board: Suspension in part of General Order: Medical Officer's Fees.

Sheffield Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Sheffield Union, in the County Borough of Sheffield and the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within certain Unions, including the said Sheffield Union; and by Articles 177, 182, and 183 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, in pursuance of the provisions of Article 158 of the said General Order, have divided the Union into Districts for Medical Relief, and one of such Districts is termed the "Central District";

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the said Articles 177, 182, and 183 as regards the Medical Officer for the said "Central District":

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of Articles 177, 182, and 183 of the above-cited Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the said "Central District," in the said Sheffield Union.

1. 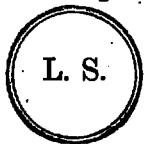

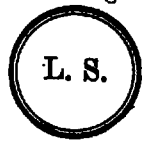

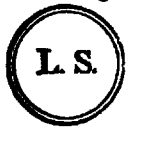

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Out-door Officer in the Customs Department.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 25. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the month in which the Examination is held.

2. Candidates must be unmarried and without family, unless they are already serving in the Customs Department.

3. No Candidate will be eligible for appointment who is less than 5 ft. 4 in. in height, and 34 in. round the chest, or who, if 5 ft. 10 in. and upwards in height, is less than 35 in. round the chest.

To all to whom these presents shall come, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

WHEREAS a new church has been built within the ancient parochial chapelry of Blawith, in the parish of Ulverston, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Carlisle, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint John the Baptist.

And whereas the Right Reverend Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, the Most Noble William Henry Walter Montagu Douglas, Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry, a Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, the Patron of the said ancient parochial chapelry of Blawith, and the Reverend John Ashburner, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Incumbent of the same chapelry, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the fifteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said chapelry of Blawith that the said new church of Saint John the Baptist, situate within such chapelry, should be substituted for the old church of the same chapelry.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instrument under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, and of the said William Henry Walter Montagu Douglas, Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry, and of the said John Ashburner, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint John the Baptist, situate within the said chapelry of Blawith, and

duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old church of the same chapelry, and that such new church shall henceforth be the church of the said chapelry of Blawith, in lieu of the said old church of the same chapelry, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint John the Baptist so hereby substituted, had been originally the church of the same chapelry.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old church of the said chapelry of Blawith, or of or belonging to the Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint John the Baptist (now being by virtue of these presents the church of the said chapelry of Blawith), and to the Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have hereunto set our common seal, and the said Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said William Henry Walter Montagu Douglas, Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry, and the said John Ashburner have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals, this twenty-fifth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

## SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.
