HE new Captain-General Mocenigo has taken his Leave of the Senate, in order to his departure for the Levant, and has received Affurancs from them, that a Reinforcement of 10 or 12000 Men shall be sent to him early in the Spring, with feveral new Ships and Galleys that are now building in the Arsend here. The Officers that are to be employed in the new Levies, have many of them already received their Commissions, and the rest will likewise have theirs very speedily. We have an account from Dalmatia, that General Molino was come to Castel Nove, to view the Fortifications of that place, and to take an account of the State of the Garison, and that from thence he would go to Spalatro, intending to draw a Body of his Troops together, n order to some considerable Enterprize,

ho soon as the Weather is proper for it.

Vienna, November 30. The Elector of Bavaria is daily expected here, after whose unival a Great Council of War will be held, to concert the Measures for the approaching Campagne, as well in Germany in Hungary. On the 18th instant pased by this place 1800 Horse and Dragoons, detached out of feveral Regiments on their march towards Hungary, where our Army will take the Field the next year much earlier than they have yet done fince this War. Several Officers that escaped from Belgrade, have been Examin'd before the Council of War concerning the loss of that Place; and General Afre-mont, late Governor of it, will in few days be brought to his Tryal before them. Francfort, December 6. The States of Suabia and Franconia are still assembled, to consult about the new Levies, and the other Preparations they intend to make against the next Campagne. The Bishop of Wurtsbourg, besides Recruits for the Regiments he has already on foot, has refolved to raife this Winter a Regiment of Cuiraffiers, and another of Foot. have an account from Heydelberg, that they work very hard on the Fortifications of that City, and that they have a Garifon there of 4000 Men; The Hullurs, that are Quartered thereabouts, have of late defeated feveral small French Parties, which were lent out from Philipsbourg and other Places to make Incursions into the Palatinate.

Mentz, December 5. Our Governor the Baron de Thunghen employs his utmost care for the putting this place into luch a poflure, as not to fear any attempt of the Enemy, who feem'd lately, by their drawing together about Wormes, to have some design this way, but our Parties bring us an account, that they are retired again. Our Elector being perfectly recovered of his late Indisposition, is gone to reside at Aschoffenburg; We are told, that the Prince of Neubourg, Great Master of the Teutonick Order, is shortly expected here, and that he is to have the Chief Command of the Imperial Forces that are lodged on the Rhine, in the place of General Souches, who is going to serve in Hungary in the Quality of ieutenant-General.
