

the division of the Rural Deanery of Penllyn and Edeirnon in the said Archdeaconry of Wrexham into two rural deaneries, to be called respectively the Rural Deanery of Penllyn, and the Rural Deanery of Edeirnon.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Alfred George Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this Scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said Rural Deanery of Penllyn and Edeirnon shall be divided into two new rural deaneries, one of which shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Penllyn,' and shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or cures or churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of such Rural Deanery in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and the other of the said two new rural deaneries shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Edeirnon,' and shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or cures or churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of the last-mentioned Rural Deanery in the said Schedule;—and each of the said parishes, or cures, or churches, shall belong to and be and form part of the Archdeaconry of Wrexham aforesaid, and of the Rural Deanery under the name of which it is set down as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery under which it is so set down as aforesaid, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Archdeaconry or of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in Law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of St. Asaph.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity Southall situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint
