Turks were taken and made flaves, and a confiderable part of the lading recovered.

A Tartan from Gorfu adviles us that feveral Privateers belonging to this Republick, Maltha, end other places, had joyned themfelves together in the Gulph of Rhodes, and leifed on 12 Turkifh Saichs laden with Provisions intended for Canca.

Here is lately strived in this City a new Nuncio from His Holinefs Monfegnior Trotti, but is at prefent entertained privately and tracgnito, till his Train can be provided for his publick Entry; his Predeceffor in that employment Monfegnior Braseaccio, has taken his leave of the Duke and Senate, and is departed by the way of Padua for Rome.

The leafon having been of late very wet and formy, the Duke was thereby difappointed of his intentions of performing the usual Ceremony upon Holy Thurfday of elpoufing the usual Lido, and has therefore deferred it till next Sunday.

The cenate being informed that the Defign of the Grand Vifier to attempt our Gallies, being diffeov. red by a Greek, and confequently a glorious Victory obtained for us by his means, have in recompence thereof, ordered him a Penfion of 50 Ducats a moneth.

The Mareichal Wurtz continues stil here, and has not yet taken the resolution of viewing the Leaguer at Berg-opzoom, f om whence his Highnels the Prince of Orange is lately-geturned; the late Rains having so spoiled the Moor upon which they were to have drawn up, that he could not have the faits action of being present at the exercising of them.

Don Francisco de Melo Ambassadour Extraordinary f om the Crown of Portugal, has given in a Memorial to the States, desiring one of their ships to transport him from thence; which the States have readily granted him, and given Order to the Admiralty to furnish him: he intends in few dayes to take his leave in order to his Imbarcation.

From Cologne we are told that the differences between that City and his Highness their Elector, grow daily wider, in somuch that they have proceeded to the burning of each others Placaerts. The French forces quartering in Limburgb, give not a little jealousite to that City, where the Burgers have taken the best order they are able for their fecurity; having instead of 3, commanded 8 Companies to be constantly upon the Guard. The Elector has required five of the principal Citizens to be delivered up to him, laying leveral Crimes to their Charge; but the Citizens not thinking them guilty, have refused to give them up.

From Aix la Ghappelle they write that the French who are quartered in Limbourg, commit leveral outrages in the Countrey, and come daily in confiderable numbers into Aix 3 but Monficur Colbert affures them they have no intentions againft that place. About 1200 French Hork and 800 Dragoons, are lately matched by them, 'tis faid, to take up their Quarters in Gelderland.

Hare is lately arrived the Prince of Tarante from his Government of Hertogenbosch. Several Officers belonging to the Lunenburgh forces, are lately come to see this place 3 where are also met the Deputies of the Admiralty. 'Tis faid Order is now given for 18 Men of War of confiderable firength to be speedily fitted up and sheathed for a long Voyage.

The States have nominated feveral perfons for their Deputies to take a view of the Fleet now riding at the Texell, and to haften them out to fea.

They have also given our lately several Commissions to

Officers Mointed to comman ; the Lunenburgh Forces lately arrived

Bruffell May 25. Yesterday arrived here the Ratificati<sup>2</sup> on of the Treaty of Peace from France : whereupon a Council was immediately called to confider what was to be done in order to the Publication thereof, which (tistaid) is to be folemnly performed on Monday next.

However the French full keep us bulie by their frequent allarums, having the last night killed one of our Sentinels. This morning all our Cavalry are Ordered to draw together near the Suburbs.

Paris, May 25. Monfieur Colbert is by His Majefly ordered to leave Aix la Chappelle, and to repair to Colognes to be prefent there at an Ailemb y of the Princes of the Rhine.

The Ratification of the Peace is now arrived in the form defired by France, conformable to what was Signed at Aix la Chapelle, and 'tis believed by to morrow it may be Exchanged, and a day assigned for the Publication of the Peace.

Bruges, May 27. The Duke de Grequy is by Order from His Moft Chrittian Majetty, retired with his atmy from these Quarters, and withdrawn within the limits of the French Garrifons. By an Express from the Marquits de Gafiel Rodrigo to the Marquifs de salagar, we are informed that Don Juan embarked the 17th instant, and confequently may fuddenly be expected at Offend.

Tarmouth, May 18. On Friday last the Speedwell and French Vittory fet fail out of this road, intending for Ireland, to guard the Fishing upon those Coasts. On Sa urday last came in a frip of this Town from Amfterdam, having patied thorow the Dutch Fleet riding at the Texell, conlisting of 25 Men of War, who intended the last Friday to put to fea for the Downs. About 50 fail of laden Colliers have within thele two wayes passed thorow this road to the fouthwards.

Portfmouth May 19. On Sunday laft the Revenge and Dragon went out of this Harbour, and the fame Afternoon two great Spanish N en of War full of fouldiers, passed by SpitLead for Flanders, the headmost having the King of Spains Flag at the Mizen topmast-head, the Dragon fired a Gun at him to strike, which he not doing, immediately fired a fectord, and a third through hims, whereupon he struck, surled his k lag about his Staff, and so itood his Courst.
