THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notices respecting quarantine received from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for Cyprus :-

No. 1392.—Quarantine.

UNDER the powers vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that-

1. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus from Adalia and the Coast to the East thereof as far as but not including Mersina, and from Tripoli and the Coast to the South thereof as far as and including Jaffa, shall be subjected to strict medical inspection, and if, in the opinion of the Health Officer making the inspection, there are reasonable grounds for doubt as to the expediency of admitting any such vessel to pratique, such officer shall refuse to admit such vessel to pratique and shall direct such vessel to proceed to Larnaca.

2. Nothing in the foregoing regulations shall be held to prevent the Chief Superintendent of Quarantine, should he think it advisable, from refusing to admit any vessel to pratique.

No. 1400.—QUARANTINE.

UNDER the powers vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that—

I. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus, except the port of Larnaca, from Adalia and the Coast to the east and south thereof as far as but not including Tripoli, unless they have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port and are provided with a clean bill of health,

shall be repelled.

2. Vessels arriving at the port of Larnaca from Adalia and the Coast to the east and south thereof as far as but not including Tripoli shall be placed in quarantine for at least ten clear days, unless such vessels have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port and are provided with a clean bill of health. Any passengers permitted to land from such vessels shall be landed in quarantine and shall undergo a quarantine of at least ten clear days from the date of leaving the ship. Passengers' baggage and merchandise shall be landed in quarantine and shall undergo, at the i i risk and cost of the owner or consignee, such disinfection as may be considered necessary by the Superintendent of Quarantine. Rags shall be repelled. Mails, except those forwarded in tarred bags from non-infected countries, shall be landed in quarantine, disinfected and delivered to the Postal Authorities with all possible despatch.

3. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus from Tripoli and the Coast to the south thereof, as far as and including Jaffa, shall be subjected to strict medical inspection, and if, in the opinion of the health officer making the inspection, there are reasonable grounds for doubt as to the expediency of admitting any such vessel to pratique, such officer shall refuse to admit such vessel to pratique and shall direct such vessel to

proceed to Larnaca.

Nothing in the foregoing regulations shall be held to prevent the Chief Superintendent of Quarantine, should he think it advisable, from refusing to admit any vessel to pratique.

ORDER of the Local Government Board I under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:-

Berkshire and Oxfordshire Audit District.

To Augustine Frederick Palliser Barton, of 12, Mandeville - place, London, District Auditor ;-

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order :

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;

To the Highway Board for each of the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order ;-

To the Authorities referred to in Article I (4) of this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act;

And whereas the said Augustine Frederick Palliser Barton is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes

in that behalf;

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Augustine Frederick Palliser Barton accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:-

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor, from and after the date hereof, to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers: namely,-

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the First Schedule to this

- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order, such Districts being partly within one or more of the said Unions.
- (4.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions.
- (5.) Such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that, behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said Augustine Frederick Palliser Barton shall, from and after the date hereof, act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, and which shall be termed "The Berkshire

We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (5) of the said Article I.

ARTICLE IV .- In this Order-

The term "Union" includes any union of Parishes incorporated or united for the relief or maintenance of the Poor under any Act of Parliament.

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Guardians" includes any Governors, Directors, Acting Guardians, Vestrymen, or other Officers appointed or entitled to act in the distribution or ordering of relief to the Poor from the Poor Rates under any Act of Parliament.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

No Candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

3. No Candidate can be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that he possesses the requisite amount of proficiency in the following subjects:

1. Handwriting.

2. Orthography.

3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).

4. English Composition.

With this view, Preliminary Examinations in these subjects will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.

Application for permission to attend one of these Preliminary Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commis-

4. A fee of £1 will be required from every Candidate attending a Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of £5 from every Candidate who may be admitted to the Competition.

5. Out of the list resulting from each Competitive Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):-

(a.) All the vacancies in Class I which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners up to the date at which the notice of the Examination is published in the London Gazette;

(b.) Such other vacancies (being in the "New Higher Division of the Playfair Scheme' as the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords of the Treasury, shall estimate as likely to occur before the expiration of six months from the commencement of the Examination;

(c.) Any additional vacancies in Class I occurring within the same period which the Head of the Department may desire to have

Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for a vacancy (b) or for the chance of a vacancy (c). When vacancies (b) or (c) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b) or (c).

By the term "New Higher Division of the

Playfair Scheme" in this Regulation are meant situations to be filled under Regulations "Class I," with salaries commencing at £100, and rising by annual increments of £12 10s. to £400.

the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of

any passenger. 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any

damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the con-

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor, or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.
