BY virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the Act of the twenty-fourth year of King George the Third, chapter twenty-six, for issuing writs during any recess of the House of Commons, whether by prorogation or adjournment;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that the Right Honourable Sir James Fergusson, Bart., late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the North-Eastern Division of Manchester, hath accepted the office of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, and has been gazetted thereto in the London Gazette, dated the 22nd day of September, 1891, and has thereby vacated his seat; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said North-Eastern Division of Manchester, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
