From Harana facke in Transi vania General Pace writes of the 20th patt, that one Mikos Paulo a Transilvanian Gentleman, who has taken part with Teckeley, had lately made an Incursion into that Country with 1000 Horse from Valachia, and sack'd a great Village, killed feveral of the Inhabitants, and hang'd three Gentlemen; after which, upon notice that the Germans from the next Garitons were marching towards them, they retired by the same passing of the Mountains by which they came. From Croatis the Letters of the 26th of the less Month give an account, that their Ban Count Erd. odi had reinforced the Garison of Jessenovits, and had assembled all the Militia of that Province, in order to attack a Body of Turks that was encamped near Kochor. Laft night arrived here the Elector of Bavaria, and in a day or two a great Council of War will be held, at which his Electoral Highness is to affilt. The Troops, which the States of the Hereditary Countries have promifed for the Emperor's Service, are raising with all possible diligence, and will be compleat before the end of March; And we are affured the Emperor will very early the next year have an Army of 80000 Men in Hungary, and about 25000 on the Rhine. This morning arrived here an Express from Prince Louis of Baden with an accounthat he was marching with 10000 Men towards the Enemy, who thereupon retired towards Great Wa-radin; but that some of his Froops had cut off a Party of Tartars, having killed 100, and taken 50 Prisoners.

Mentz, December 17. Four Regiments of Heffe are polited near this City, and in readiness to reinforce this Garifon, or to go upon any other Service as there may be occasion.
