IT is hereby notified that Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from the Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Argentine Republic at this Court, a Note, dated the 13th of October, stating that the Argentine Government has cancelled the Commission of Mr. Abelardo Aldana as Argentine Vice-Consul at Southampton.

BY virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so "much of two Acts made in the tenth and "fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the "House of Commons to issue his Warrant to "the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs "for the election of Members to serve in Par-"liament, in the manner therein mentioned, and "for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define "the time for proceeding to Election during the "Recess:"
